

ANNAPOLIS, JULY 16.

Saturday last, arrived here, the Ship THORNTON, Capt. REED, from LONDON, with One Hundred and Fifty-two of his Majesty's Seven Years Passengers.

Monday Evening last, about 10 o'Clock, a Servant Man, belonging to Col. YOUNG, fell from on board a Schooner, which he had the navigating of, lying in the River SEVERN, and was unfortunately drowned. His Body has since been found, and decently interred.

Tuesday Morning last, died at his House in Cambridge, after a lingering Indisposition, the Hon. CHARLES GOLDSBOROUGH, Esq; one of his Lordship's Council of State, and Commissary-General of this Province. He was a Gentleman eminent for many Years, in the Knowledge and Practice of the Law, and was formerly one of the Representatives for Dorchester County.
