

NEW-YORK, July 13.

On Monday last arrived the Amity's Production, Capt. Thomas Noble, with 99 Soldiers on board, under the Command of Captain Marsden. They left the Cove of Cork, the 20th of May, in Company with Five other Transport Ships for this Place, and Three for Philadelphia, under the Command of Agent Henry Francis Evans, which Captain Noble parted from in the Night, Lat. 37: 27, Lon. 61: 12, but the next Day all the other Five that were bound here, arrived, viz.

The Hunter, Captain Hunter; Scarborough, Captain Tate; the Amity's Production, Captain Noble; having on board the 16th Regiment, under the Command of Colonel (Gabbit.) The Amity's Assistance, Captain Knowles; the Lyde, Captain Watton; the Eagle, Captain Sligholm; having the 26th Regiment, under the Command of Major Templar.

The 26th Regiment, we hear, is stationed at Perth-Amboy, and other Towns in New-Jersey, for which Place the Three Ships sailed last Thursday.

The 17th and 28th Regiments, we hear, will embark on board the Transports, as soon as they can be got ready for their Reception.

By the Papers we learn, that Captain McBride was arrived from the Coast of Patagonia, in the South-Sea, and confirms the Account given by Commodore Byron, with regard to the Place and Size of the Inhabitants; and that he staid at Falconer's Island Twelvemonths, to try the Soil and Climate, which he found to be very good, fertile, healthy and temperate.
