SCHEME OF THE MARYLAND LIBERTY LOTTERY.

The Lower House of Assembly of Maryland have constantly and ineffectually hitherto, since Seventeen Hundred and Thirty-nine, RESOLVED, That his Majesty hath no Right to collect Twelve-pence per Hoghead of Tobacco exported.

A Constitutional Tax on the People to support an Appeal of the Appointment of the Lower House, has been frequently attempted, and as often refused by the Upper House.

The Lower House of Assembly contend, That the Clerks of the Council his reasonable Reward, as well as every other Expence necessarily attending the Execution of the Powers of Government, ought to be defrayed out of the Funds, Forfeitures, Amerciaments, and other Monies received by the Government for the Support thereof; and, That the same being directly opposite to the Opinion of the Upper House had, on mature Consideration, formed upon the Subject of the Clerk of the Council's Claim, principally occasioned the Non-payment of the Public Debt for upwards of Ten Years: The Distress of Trade for Want of a circulating Medium, and the extreme Necessity of Public Credit, compelled the Lower House to agree to an Appeal to his Majesty in Council, on the Subject Matter of Difference, without the Allotment of any Public Money for that Purpose, as the only Means to settle Disputes, restore Public Credit, and lay a sure Foundation for the future Ease and Good of the Province.

A Subscription therefore, by Resolution of the Lower House, has been Open'd, and Subscriptions are taken in every Member, for maintaining an Agent, and supporting the Appeal on the Part of the People, as well as obtaining Redress of their other Grievances; and, by Resolution of the Lower House, as an additional Means of raising Money for the same Purposes, the following SCHEME of a LOTTERY, by which to raise One Thousand Pounds Common Money, is submitted to the Public.

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The following Proposals are intended to be presented to the Trustees of Philadelphia College of Philadelphia

A Meeting of the Board, that Degrees in Physic, would encourage the Medical School, this Seminary, promote the Students, and tend to put the on a more respectable footing. Motion was unanimously agreed following Course of Studies and mature Deliberation, was fixed requisite to entitle physical Student Degrees, viz.

For a BACHELOR'S DEGREE. It is required that such Student take a Degree in any College, or Professors of the College Knowledge in the Latin Tongue, Branches of Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, as shall be judged necessary for the medical Education.

Each Student shall attend Lectures in Anatomy, Mathematics, the Theory and Practice of Physic, and the Principles of Surgery. One Course of Clinical Lectures, the Practice of the Pennsylvania Year; and may then be admitted for a Bachelor's Degree, that, on a previous private Examination, he has a general Knowledge of the Medical School.

It is further required, previous to the Bachelor's Degree, a sufficient Apprenticeship as Practitioner in Physic, and be a year that he has a general Knowledge of the Medical School.

QUALIFICATIONS for a DOCTOR OF PHYSIC.

It is required for this Degree, that the Candidate have intervened from the Bachelor's Degree, and the full 24 Years of Age, and that defend a Thesis, publicly, in should be beyond Seas, or for the Continent of America, as not to be at once manifest Inconvenience; sending a written Thesis, such by the College, the Candidate Doctor's Degree, but his Thesis published at his own Expence.

This Scheme of a Medical Education to be on as extensive and liberal as possible, and in the most respectable European Seminary.
