THE Lower House of Assembly of *Maryland* have con-  
 stantly and ineffectually-hitherto, since Seventeen  
 Hundred and Thirty-nine, RESOLVED, That his Lov-  
 ship hath no Right to collect Twelve-pence per Household  
 Tobacco exposed.

A Constitutional Tax on the People to support an Ap-  
 pointment of the Lower House, has been greatly  
 desired, frequently attempted, and as often refused by the  
 Upper House.

The Lower House of Assembly contend, That the Clerks  
 of the Council his reasonable Reward, as well as every other  
 Expence necessarily attending the Execution of the Powers  
 of Government, ought to be defrayed out of the Public  
 Forfeitures, Amerciaments, and other Monies received by the  
 Government for the Support thereof; and, "That Sen-  
 timent being directly opposite to the Opinion of the  
 "House had, on mature Consideration, formed upon the  
 "Subject of the Clerk of the Council's Claim," principally  
 occasioned the Non-payment of the Public Debt for upwards  
 of Ten Years: The Distress of Trade for Want of a Circu-  
 lating Medium, and the extreme Necessity of Public Credit,  
 compelled the Lower House to agree to an Appeal to his Ma-  
 jesty in Council, on the Subject Matter of Difference, with-  
 out the Allotment of any Public Money for that Purpose,  
 as the only Means to settle Disputes, restore Public Credit,  
 and lay a sure Foundation for the future Ease and Good  
 of the Province.
