SCHEME OF THE MARYLAND LIBERTY LOTTERY.

THE Lower House of Assembly of Maryland have constantly and incessantly hitherto, since Seventeen Hundred and Thirty-nine, RESOLVED, That his Majesty hath no Right to collect Twelve-pence per Hoghead of Tobacco exported.

A Constitutional Tax on the People to support an Appointment of the Lower House, has been proposed, frequently attempted, and as often refused by the Upper House.

The Lower House of Assembly contend, That the Clerk of the Council his reasonable Reward, as well as every other Expence necessarily attending the Execution of the Powers of Government, ought to be defrayed out of the Funds of the Government, and other Monies received by the Government for the Support thereof; and, That such a Measure is directly opposite to the Opinion of the Upper House, had, on mature Consideration, formed upon the Subject of the Clerk of the Council's Claim, which occasioned the Non-payment of the Public Debt for upwards of Ten Years: The Distress of Trade for Want of a Circulating Medium, and the extreme Necessity of Public Credit, compelled the Lower House to agree to an Appeal to his Majesty in Council, on the Subject Matter of Difference, without the Allotment of any Public Money for that Purpose, as the only Means to settle Disputes, restore Public Credit, and lay a sure Foundation for the future Ease and Good of the Province.

XXIII. YEAR. MARYLAND

The following Proposals are inserted by the Trustees of Philadelphia College of Philadelphia

A College of Philadelphia. A Meeting of the Board, that conducted the Seminary, would encourage the Medical School, in this Seminary, promote Emulation, and tend to put the Seminary on a more respectable Footing. Motion was unanimously agreed to, that a Course of Studies and Qualifications for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, was fixed on, as requisite to entitle physical Students to the Degree, viz.

For a BACHELOR'S DEGREE. I. It is required that such Student taken a Degree in any College, or University, should have a License to teach, or a Degree in Physic, and Professors of the College, and Knowledge in the Latin Tongue, Branches of Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, as shall be judged necessary for the Degree.

II. Each Student shall attend at least one Course of Lectures in Anatomy, Maternity, the Theory and Practice of Medicine, and the Practice of the Pennsylvania Year; and may then be admitted to a Bachelor's Degree in that, on a previous private Examination by the Trustees and Professors, and Professors as chuse to attend. Students shall be judged fit to undertake the Degree, without attending any of the Medical School.

III. It is further required, that previous to the Bachelor's Degree, the Candidate should have a sufficient Apprenticeship to the Profession in Physic, and be able to give a general Knowledge of the Medical School.

QUALIFICATIONS for a DOCTOR OF PHYSIC.

It is required for this Degree that the Candidate shall have intervened from the Bachelor's Degree, and that he should be at least 24 Years of Age, and that he defend a Thesis, publicly, in the City of Philadelphia, or in some other Part of America, as not to be able to defend a Thesis, publicly, in the City of Philadelphia, or in some other Part of America, as not to be able to defend a Thesis, publicly, in the City of Philadelphia, or in some other Part of America.

A complete Course of Lectures on the Theory and Practice of Medicine, to which will be added all the Operations of Surgery, and the Mode of applying Bandages, &c.

A Course of Lectures on the Theory and Practice of Medicine, which will be preceded by an Explanation of the Theory of the Human Body, and accompanied with some necessary Experiments, to render the Candidate a Knowledge of this Science, and to qualify him for the inquisitive Student. A Course of CLINICAL LECTURES, to be given in the Pennsylvania Hospital.
