The following, among other Bills, lie ready for the Royal Aftent; viz.

The Bill to continue feveral Laws relating to the running of uncultomed Goods; to prevent the running of Goods, and the Danger of Infection thereby to the granting Liberty to carry Rice from Carolina and Georgia, in America, directly to any Part of Europe, Southward of Cape Finisterre; and to the prohibiting the Exportation of Books reprinted abroad, and first written and printed in Great-Britain.

The Bill for the free Importation of Cochineal and Indigo, and for allowing the Bounties upon the Exportation of Corn and Malt, declared or made for Exportation, and Barley steeped, and entered to be made into Malt for Exportation, be-

fore a limited Time.

We hear that the Infinuation which was lately propagated, that the Right Hon. Mr. Conway was to refign as Secretary of State, and get the first vacant Regiment, is entirely without Foundation, that Right Hon.
