They write from Leghorn, that the Senate of Genoa has offered the Sum of Two Millions of French Livres, to General Paoli, for re-delivery of Capraia, which was refused.

An eminent Corn-Factor has sent over Commissions for Thirty Thousand Quarters of Corn to be imported, in different Bottoms, from New-York, Maryland, New-England, and Pennsylvania.

It is said Orders have been sent over to Holland and Germany, to postpone the farther engaging Protestant Palatines for the new Settlements in America.

EDINBURGH, July 20. The Lord Provost, Magistrate, and Council of this City, have offered a Reward of 200l. Sterling to any Person or Persons, who shall discover the Author or Authors, of certain incendiary Letters, sent some Days ago to the Right Hon. the Lord President of the Court of Sessions, threatening to murder his Lordship, and burn his Houses in Town and Country, for the Judgement given by him in a Cause lately depending before that Court.

BOSTON, September 21. By our latest Advices from London, which came down to the 8th and 9th of July, we are informed, that the King has established the Admiralty-Office, for the New-England Provinces, and appointed ROBERT ACHMUTY, Esq; Judge, with 300l. Sterling per Annum, and to have no Fees; JONATHAN SEWALL, Esq; Advocate-General, and Mr. ARODI TRAYER, Marshal.

We hear that the Salaries of the Governors of New-York and Massachusetts will be 2500l. Sterling each, per Annum. The Governor of New-Hampshire 1000l. The Chief Judges of the Two First Provinces, and the Secretary, 500l. each.

NEW-YORK, September 14. By Letters from Montreal, we learn, that Three Frenchmen, sent out by Monsieur La Corne, are lately returned there, after 26 Months Journey in the Wilderness, they having been 1500 Miles farther than Mishlamackana, in Search of the North-West Passage; and we hear they have made many useful Discoveries, and that they actually met with a very large River that ebb'd and flow'd.

ANNAPOLIS, OCTOBER 3. The Sloop POTTS, Capt. COOKE, is arrived from MADEIRA, which Place he left the 21st of August; and informs, that the Brig ELISABETH, Capt. FEARIS, belonging to PHILADELPHIA, was to sail in Four Days after him.

To cure which, begin with repeated Bleeding. Give the Horse, Morning and Evening, a Ball of Brimstone and Saltpetre, from Half an Ounce, to an Ounce of each, made up in Paste: Inject sharp Vinegar in his Nostrils, and bathe the Outside of his Throat with Vinegar, Hog's Lard, and Camphire.—N. B. The putting Tar on the Bridle Bits of such Horses as have hitherto escaped the Infection, has proved a good Prefer- vative against it.
