Admiral Emo, on his Side, offered no more than 10,000 Sequins, besides the Presents which the Dey demanded on his Accession to the Rewhich the Dey demanded on his Accession to the Regency, but without the Ship-Timber. The Dey refused these Osters, and told M. Emo, that, 'if he did not agree to what he had demanded, he had nothing to do but to return.' This last Interview passed the 20th of this Month, and next Day the Four Ships, which composed the Venetian Squadron, put to Sea. Immediately after their Departure, Notice was given to the Cortairs, that they might attack the Venetian Ships, and take them wherever they met with them."
