

In like Manner, went through the same Ceremonies of burying the Bones of such of his Majesty's Subjects as have been killed by their People since the Peace. In the Answers they returned to the Speeches delivered to them, they expressed the utmost Satisfaction in meeting Commissioners from the Government of Pennsylvania, and having an Opportunity of renewing the Peace and Friendship which formerly subsisted between them and the People of this Province. The several Tribes being earnestly desired to open their Minds fully, by disclosing every Thing which gave them the least Discontent or Uneasiness; they publickly acknowledged, that their Hearts were now made easy, with respect to the several Losses they had sustained, and that they entirely buried in Oblivion all past Misfortunes, so that their Children might never remember them hereafter. They then acquainted the Commissioners, that the only Matter which they had still reason to complain of, was, the Settlements made on their Lands. But, before the Conferences ended, during which the Indians behaved in the most orderly and friendly Manner, they were made so fully sensible that the Government had taken every Step to remove those lawless People, who had settled on their Lands, and to apprehend and bring to Justice the Villains Stump and Ironcutter, that they expressed great Satisfaction at our Public Conduct. They afterwards, according to their Custom, cleared and made smooth the Road of Peace, so as to be travelled by all People with Pleasure and Safety, brightened and strengthened the ancient Chain of Friendship, and engaged, in the most hearty Manner, to unite with their Brethren the English, in holding it fast for ever, and to live with them in the strictest Harmony for the future.

At the Conclusion of the Treaty, the Commissioners delivered considerable Presents of Goods to the several Tribes, in behalf of the Province of Pennsylvania; to which Mr. Croghan made an Addition on the Part of the Crown. The whole ended to the entire Satisfaction of all the Indians, who parted with the Commissioners in so friendly a Disposition, as promises to us the fairest Prospect of a lasting Peace. We are assured that Mr. Croghan discovered the greatest Knowledge and Address in the Management of the Indians on this Occasion, and gave Proofs not only of his Attachment to his Majesty's Service in general, but the most sincere and earnest Desire to promote the particular Interests and Welfare of this Province.

H A L I F A X, (Nova-Scotia) May 2. In Capt. Brown came a Commission, appointing Lieutenant Governor Franklin, to the Settlement of St. John's in Bay Fundy.

Mr. Franklin has appointed Isaac Deschamps, Esq; Chief Justice of St. John's, with a Salary of 300 l.

Orders are received for carrying on the Settlement of the Island of St. John, and for establishing a Civil Government there immediately. Three Towns are to be laid out by the Names of Charlotte-Town, George-Town, and Prince-Town; and a Number of Noblemen and Gentlemen in England are to have Grants of Townships in the Island, and there is the greatest Prospect of its becoming a flourishing Settlement.

W I L L I A M S B U R G, June 2. We hear that in the Night of Wednesday the 25th Ult. Capt. Waterman, from London, for York-River, ran ashore about 40 Miles to the Northward of the Capes; and it is said both Vessel and Cargo are lost; but the Crew saved.

A N N A P O L I S, JUNE 16.

Two Petitions having been preferred to the Honourable the Lower House of Assembly, by sundry Inhabitants of Baltimore County, complaining of an undue Election, and Return, of Four Delegates to serve in the General Assembly of this Province, for said County. The Petitioners were allowed to summon Evidences, in order to examine into the Allegations therein set forth, which being fully proved, (except a Complaint against the High Sheriff, of which he was honourably acquitted) the said Election was, on Tuesday last, determined void, and a Writ will immediately issue for a new Election. At a Meeting of the Vestry of St. Anne's Parish, on Monday last, the Reverend Mr. WILLIAM EDMISTON produced his Induction, as Rector, and was received by the Vestry accordingly.

On Sunday Evening last, Three Men went into the River to bathe, and being much in Liquor, one of them was drowned.
