S H I P N E W S.

Merchant Seamen's Harbour, March 23.

THE Fleet that took shelter here a few Days ago, having refitted, and taken in a large Cargo, consisting of the following Articles, Allspice, Fuller's Earth, Varnish, Wash-Balls, Puffs, scowering Paper, soft Paper, Rattles, musical Clocks, Toys of all Kinds, &c. &c. were joined by a great Number of Victuallers and small Craft, failed this Day at one o'Clock, P. M. with fair Wind and fine Weather, under Convoy of the following Ships; viz. the Address, Capt. Boehm; the Omnium, Capt. Van Neck; the Grafton, Capt. Sawmill; and the Contract, Capt. Harley. At Half past Two most of the Fleet put back in a dreadful Condition, having been taken all a-back, with a sudden and violent Gale, which laid most of them on their Beam-Ends; in which Situation they were attacked by the Enemy's Cutters. The best Sailors seeing the Weather look so extremely black, bore away, and ran directly into Port, others haul'd their Wind, and tried to go North about (the best Passage now). The Address, Capt. Boehm, who had the broad Pennant, was attacked by a whole Squadron of the Enemy's Ships; but after firing away all their Ammunition and Stink Pots, the whole Crew quitted her, and went on board a small Transport, and escaped by Mistake: The Engagement had made such an Alteration in their Appearance, that the Enemy mistook them for some of their own People.

The Omnium, Capt. Van Neck, and the Contract, Capt. Harley, were spoke with in great Distress, with the Dead-Lights up, and Signals of Distress under very different Colours than they failed with; but as both Ships were well known, particularly the latter, who neglected her Duty so much when she was Guard-Ship, that no Notice was taken to relieve their Distress. Many others were seen on the Caren, refitting, with black Flags and red Crosses at their Mast-Heads.

The Grafton has so many Shot through her Upper Works, that, with the Damage in a late Cruise,

when all her Hands deserted, 'tis thought she can never be made fit for the Sea again, but will be kept for a Hulk or break Water.

ANNAPOLIS, JUNE 15.

Extra of a Letter from a Gentleman in London, a Friend in this City, dated April 13.

"Tho' I have but a Moment to write, I can't help saying, we are all in Confusion here: The — of — notwithstanding *Witkes* has been Four Times called for *Middlesex*, refuse to let him sit, and have at length (the 15th Instant) chose a Representative for that County, one Col. Luttrell, of the Dragoons: This you may be sure, will not sit easy on the Stomachs of the Freeholders of England, and what will be the Consequence, cannot be told, for there is Fire enough in the Minds of most People, to raise such a Flame, as would not be easily extinguished.—Thank Heaven this — M—y have their Hands so full at home, that they have no Time to think of new Oppressions for poor America.

"There seems to be very little Chance this Session, of a Repeal of the American Revenue Acts, but still I would wish you could refrain from Violence, and apply steadily to the Encouragement of Manufactures and Frugality, which, in the End, will, and must ensure Redress."

On Monday last his Excellency our Governor, with the Advice of his Lordship's Council, was pleased further to prorogue the General Assembly of this Province, to the Second Tuesday in November next.

ST. JAMES'S, March 21.

This Day a most numerous Body of the Merchants, Traders and other principal Inhabitants of the City of London, waited on his Majesty, and being introduced by the Earl of Hertford, Lord Chamberlain of the Household, they presented the following Address:

To the KING's most Excellent MAJESTY.

Most gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Merchants, Traders, and other principal Inhabitants of your City of London, truly sensible, that it has been your Majesty's constant Care and principal Object, since you ascended the Throne of your illustrious Ancestors, to secure to your People the full Enjoyment of their Religion, Laws, and Liberties, inviolable, and to make them happy, and flourishing under your Majesty's most auspicious Government, beg Leave to profess our steady Loyalty, and Duty to your Majesty, and our firm Resolution to exert our utmost Power in supporting the Honour and Dignity of your Majesty's Crown, in preserving the Safety, Peace, and Tranquility of your Majesty's Realms, in maintaining public Credit, and promoting Commerce, for the Benefit of your Subjects throughout your Dominions.

And we beg Leave to express our Concern and Abhorrence of every Attempt to spread Sedition, to inflame the Minds, and alienate the Affections of a free and loyal People, from the best of Kings, and his Government, which, we apprehend, has of late been encouraged, without the least Shadow of Foundation, by some few ill-designing Persons, to answer sinister and selfish Purposes.

And we most sincerely pray Almighty GOD, that your Majesty's great and bright Example of Piety, Goodness, and Clemency, may operate so effectually upon the Minds of your People, as to suppress that Spirit of Licentiousness, Profaneness, and Irreligion, which has been industriously propagated, to delude the unwary to their own Destruction; and that the same good Providence will grant your Majesty a long and happy Reign over a dutiful and loyal People, and bless your Endeavours with Success, in a firm and permanent Establishment of our most excellent Constitution, which is not only admired, but envied by all foreign Nations.
