Which he accordingly did.

Prince George's County, June 9, 1770. In consequence of an Advertisement in the Maryland Gazette, requesting a general Meeting of this County in Marlborough, a Number of Inhabitants attended the Court House, and appointed Joseph Sim, Esq; Moderator. They unanimously, to adhere firmly to the Assent of the 22^d of June last, notwithstanding the Resolutions of the Tax on Paper, Galls, and Painters Colours, PRINCIPLE and Tax on TEA still remain. That in case a general Meeting should be called by the other Counties of this Province, to support the general Association, this County appoint Four Deputies, to attend at Annapolis Purpote.
