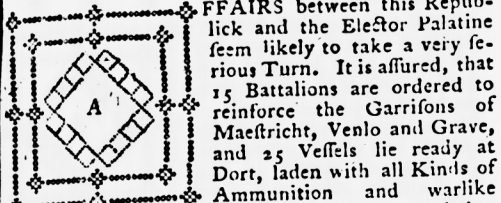

H A G U E, June 29.



AFFAIRS between this Republic and the Elector Palatine seem likely to take a very serious Turn. It is assured, that 15 Battalions are ordered to reinforce the Garrisons of Maestricht, Venlo and Grave, and 25 Vessels lie ready at Dort, laden with all Kinds of Ammunition and warlike Stores, likewise designed for those Towns, as being nearest to the Palatine Territories. In the mean Time, among many Reports that prevail here, it is said, that the Court of Vienna has intimated to the States General, that it is hoped they will not make any Attempt against the Lordship of Reveslin, belonging to the Elector Palatine.

It is assured, that the States General have accepted the Mediation offered by the Elector of Treves, provided that no Accommodation should be brought about in the Course of Six Weeks, between their High Mightinesses and the Elector Palatine.

L O N D O N.

June 16. It was this Morning reported, that Instructions have been sent to our Ambassador at the Porte, to demand the Reasons of his Britannick Majesty's Subjects in Turkey being molested in their Persons and Effects, and that Satisfaction may be made them.

June 19. Yesterday Se'nnight, in the Evening, there was a small Card Party in the Parish of St. James's, consisting of about Ten Tables; a Lady of Quality who kept the Pool at One of the Tables, making rather too free with her Trust, was reprimanded in a very spirited Manner by a young Lady who sat at the Table; on which the Pool-keeper flew at her, bored her Ears, and insisted on her quitting the Table. Query, Is this Court Breeding?

June 26. The Income of the late Lord Mayor's Estate and Plantations in Jamaica, it is said, was 30,000l. per Annum; and of his Estates in England 18,000l. per Annum, besides his Mortgages and Property in the Funds, which made him the richest Commoner next to Lord Clive in his Majesty's Dominions.

June 28. Mr. Bradshaw has ordered a Prosecution to be commenced against the Printer of a Day Paper, for a scandalous Libel therein inserted on Tuesday last, reflecting upon him, as being concerned in the corrupt Sale of an Office in America.

It is reported, that besides the usual Compliment of 1000 Guineas paid to the Count du Chatelet Lomont, the French Ambassador, on his taking leave of this Court, Orders were given for making a Gold Coronet for the said Count's Lady, which is now almost finished by an ingenious Artift in Pall-Mall, and the Price is said to be fixed at Three Thousand Pounds Sterling.

July 3. We hear that the Freeholders of the County of Middlesex intend remonstrating with the P—, at their next Meeting; that the Remonstrance is now under Consideration, and it is expected will be signed by more than that to his M—y.

Lord Viscount Palmerston, Hans Stanley, Mr. Sloane, and some other Gentlemen, lately set off in a Pleasure Boat from Southampton for Morlaix, and other Ports in France; but the French, suspecting their Designs were more than mere Pleasure, refused their coming ashore, or the Vessel going up their Harbours.

Extrañ of a Letter from Ancona, June 19.

The Day before Yesterday Letters arrived here from the Morea, of good Authority, mentioning, that the 30th ult. Prince Orlow had dispatched 2000 regular Troops, and 16,000 Mainotes, from Navarino to Corinth, to keep their Post there, in order to prevent the Turks entering the Morea. Those Troops passed Mufeniga the 4th Instant, where they met Soldia Bassa, with an Army of 30,000 Albanians; they engaged one another at 11 in the Morning, and fought very violently 'til 3 in the Afternoon; the Turks had 2000 Men killed, and 1600 taken Prisoners, and lost 24 Colours, 20 Kettle-Drums, 5 Pieces of Cannon, and a great deal of Baggage and Provisions. The rest of the Army, with Soldia Bassa, took their Flight to Lepanto; the Russians and Greeks had about 400 Men killed and 1500 wounded, among whom are 6 Officers. As soon as this Victory was gained, a strong Detachment marched to the Fortrefs of Polle Kastio, at the Straights of the Morea, to take the same.

July 5. A Correspondent from Liverpool says, that Mr. Michael Woods, of that Place, F. R. S. has absolutely discovered the Longitude.

Bank Stock has fallen 5 per Cent. and the other Funds in Proportion, within this Fortnight, which has given Birth to a Variety of Conjectures.

The sudden Arrival of Mr. Lyttleton from Portugal, the Delay of Mr. Pitt for Spain, notwithstanding all his Equipage has been ready for some Time, more likely has affected the Funds, than the Report of the Russia Loan; for, in an Affair of that Kind, the Currency is Dutch Ducats, which depends on their own internal Riches.

The King of Prussia seems determined to compel the Dutch to settle Accounts with him, for the quartering

their Troops in his Dominions, in the Year 1672, when the Dutch were at War with England and France.

Yesterday Advice was received, that the Douglafs, Brackenridge, from Maryland, is arrived safe at Dover; she had been missing several Months, and a large Premium was given upon her.

July 7. It is said, that an Army of 40,000 Men is now stationed on the Frontiers of Portugal. What this Finest Means, Time will probably soon shew.

Advice is received, that the French King, since the Beginning of last Month, has raised Twenty Millions of Livres, at Eight per Cent.

T O T H E P R I N T E R.

I find from most of the publick Prints, that the Affair relative to Falkland's Islands seems to be held as a Matter of Doubt; you must therefore give me Leave to inform you of the Circumstances.

The Situation of these Islands was supposed of the greatest Consequence to the Spanish Trade to the different Parts of South America, that border on the South Seas; and as they contain several very spacious Harbours, it was thought that the being in Possession of these Islands would be as the Key to the South Seas, from which we should be able to make continual Excursions to the Continent, and have it in our Power to intercept their Ships and distress their Trade.—Mr. Byron had Orders to take Possession, and to examine the Harbours, which he found to be large, safe, and commodious. About this Time the French had taken Possession of the other Side of the Island, which was not known 'til the Year following. This having given Umbrage to the Court of Spain, the French Minister lately ceded their Rights of Possession to the Spaniards, who sent out a sufficient Force to take Possession. Just before Captain Hunt in the Tamer left Port Egmont, Two Spanish Frigates of Thirty Guns each, having a Regiment embarked on board them, arrived there, and pretended to be surprised at finding the English, who they insisted should evacuate it. This Captain Hunt refused; upon which the Spanish commanding Officer landed, and took Possession in the Name of his Catholick Majesty, and allowed the English Officer Six Months to evacuate the Island. Captain Hunt left the Favourite Sloop of War and a Store-Ship at Port Egmont, who must contrive to avoid any Disputes with the Spaniards, as they are so greatly superior. Whether this is easy to be done, we must leave to Time to discover.
