Wednesday the Spanish Papers, relating to the Convention, came under the Consideration of the Lower Assembly. Lord B... moved in Substance as follows, "That an humble Address be presented to his Majesty, returning him Thanks for having agreed to the Convention, and for his Compliance with the Request of that Assembly, in laying the Spanish Papers before them." This Motion was seconded by Lord P... Mr. D... moved, "That all those Words contained in the Address, which conveyed the Thanks of the Club for having signed the Convention, be left out, and then the proposed Address would only thank his Majesty for having laid the Papers before them." Col. B... seconded Mr. D... Motion. W... E... Esq; spoke for a considerable Time against the proposed Alteration. The Debates then becoming general, the Question was spoke to by several Gentlemen, and Mr. D... in a Speech which lasted upwards of an Hour, finished the Debate.

The Question was then put on Mr. D... Motion, which passed in the Negative. On the Division there appeared for the Question 157; against it 175. Most Gentlemen in the Minority then left the Assembly, and Lord B... Motion to address his Majesty was carried without any farther Opposition.

The Speakers were Lord B..., Lord P..., Mr. D..., Col. B..., Mr. E..., Mr. C... F..., Gen. B..., Gen. C..., Lord N..., Adm. K..., Mr. B..., Mr. S..., Com. H..., Sir G. S..., and Mr. D... g.

On Thursday the Upper Assembly was prodigiously full, when the Spanish Papers came under their Consideration. The D. of N... made a Motion to address. The D. of M... made a Motion similar to that made by Mr. D... in the Lower Assembly on Wednesday. The Debates on the Occasion continued for several Hours, when the Address was agreed to. On the Duke of M... Motion being put, there appeared, for the Amendment 35, with Three Proxies; against it 93, with 15 Proxies. The Assembly was not up till Half past Eleven o'Clock.

The principal Speakers were the D. of N..., Lord C..., Lord H..., Lord S..., Lord R..., D. of M..., Lord A..., D. R..., Lord R..., Lord P..., Lord C..., Lord M..., Lord C..., and Lord W... h.

It is said the Two best Speeches which were made on Thursday last, were those of Lord C..., and Lord S... ne.

There are Fifty Capital Ships now in Commission, in this Kingdom, besides Fifty Gun Ships, Frigates, Sloops, Cutters, &c.

Feb. 17. Yesterday the Address voted the Wednesday before, in a certain Assembly, was carried to St. James's by the President, attended by such other Members of the Club as were of the Privy Council, and presented to his Majesty.

The Jamaica Fleet, we hear, is to be victualled only for Three Months.

Yesterday the Lord Chamberlain acquainted the Upper Assembly that the Address moved for on Thursday last had been presented to his Majesty, and that it had been graciously received.

We hear that a Protest was entered Yesterday against the Proceedings of the Upper Assembly on Thursday.

The grand Debates on the Spanish Convention are finally closed, and every future Attempt to bring it under Consideration, in order for Condemnation, is precluded by the approbatory Address voted to his Majesty; on which, it is said, the Ministry do not pique themselves more as to the Measure itself than on Account of the high Hand with which they carried it.

The hasty Motion for ordering the Printers to the Rubric is at Length condemned, we hear, by the Members on both Sides of the Room. The patriotic Side are confessedly desirous that the Publick should be in Possession of the Debates, whilst the other apprehend that any Measure adopted just at this Juncture to suppress their Publication cannot fail of being construed into an Intention to screen some latent Iniquity, of which they hold themselves perfectly innocent. In short, the Fever of the Times is not to be cured by inflammatory Physick. The Question, however, it is thought, will be brought in next Meeting.

Private Letters from Spain mention, that the Marquis Grimaldi, their Prime Minister, is from some unknown Cause, losing much of his Influence at Court; and that the deep Sighs in that Country imagine his ministerial Power is nearly at an End. If this should be Fact, and the consequent Speculation should be realized, the present Gleam of Peace would soon give Way to Appearances of a worse Nature.

Feb. 23. Thursday, at Five o'Clock in the Afternoon, a Messenger arrived at Lord Rochford's Office from Madrid, with the King of Spain's Approbation of Prince Maserano's Declaration, relative to Falkland's Island together with an Order for the Restitution of Port Egmont; upon which Notice was instantly sent to Lord North, in the Lower Assembly, where this Intelligence was immediately made known. And Yesterday Morning Notice was sent to the Coffee-Houses about the Royal Exchange, to prevent the Merchants making further Applications for Protections, as Matters were finally adjusted between England and Spain.

Twelve Hundred Thousand Pounds is the neat Sum expected upon the late Preparations for War.

NEW-YORK, April 11. A Gentleman, in about Eight Days from Newbern, in North Carolina, reports, that the Regulators, who upon the Release of Husbands, seemed to have been appeased, had begun a new Insurrection, and that Governor Tryon with a considerable Body of the Militia, was preparing to march against them.

PHILADELPHIA, April 15. Captain Sparks, from London, brings Advice of the Death of the Honourable RICHARD PENN, Esq; one of the Proprietors of this Province, and Father of his Honour our Governor.

Letters from London mention, that notwithstanding the Dissatisfaction the late injurious Compromise with Spain has given the People, the Ministry seem to be triumphantly secure, by Means of their Majority in Parliament, who sanctify all their Deeds, however baneful to their Country.

NORFOLK, April 8. On Friday last, about Four in the Afternoon, we had One of the most dreadful Storms of Hail, accompanied with Thunder and Lightning, that has ever been known here. It continued, inconceivably violent, above Half an Hour; and, what is hardly credible, the Hail that fell measured from Five to Seven Inches round. We are in Hopes, however, that it has not extended a great Way into the Country; and the principal Damage it has done in this Town is to our Gardens and Window Glass, both which have suffered extremely. In Window Glass alone, it is computed we have sustained at least Seven Hundred Pounds Damage. Some say a Thousand.

Two of the Hail Stones, put into a Scale, weighed Two Ounces. Mr. Newton had Three Hundred and Sixty-five Panes of Glass broke, Mrs. Cann lost Two Hundred and Fourteen Panes; many Fifty, Sixty, and a Hundred. Not a House escaped.
