April 28. This day the House of Commons met pursuant to their last adjournment; and on Thursday the Right Hon. the House of Peers will meet pursuant to their last adjournment.

No less than three expresses arrived yesterday at St. James's, from Sir Robert Murray Keith at Copenhagen.

It is said, the Ministry have received a printed Account of the trial of the Queen, and an explicit detail of all the late disturbances in Denmark, with their cause, the reasons for confining the Queen, &c. which it is hoped, for the satisfaction of many thousands, they will immediately publish.

Col. Pe is appointed Grand Master of the Household to the young Queen of Denmark, and his regiment of cavalry is ordered to be stationed in the neighbourhood of the castle of Aalborg, the place destined for the residence of that Princess.

There is no occasion for a war with Denmark. The Danes are so sensible of our superior strength, that they will grant us every thing from the apprehensions of a war, which we could possibly obtain by actual hostilities.

We are informed, that it is stipulated, that the sum determined to be annually allowed the Queen Consort of Denmark (which is 40,000 dollars) shall be expended within the dominions of his Danish Majesty; and in case she should return to England, that she shall be presented with 30,000 dollars, and the annual appointment cease.

His Majesty now heartily repents of having lived so long at variance with his subjects. He would willingly go to war with the Danes, to vindicate the honour of his sister; but he knows the nation would not back him. This must ever be the condition of a limited Monarch, who treads his people at defiance.

We hear that the divorce which has taken place between the King and Queen of Denmark is very satisfactory to the latter and to her family; and that no farther punishment will be inflicted on her; and that there will be no rupture between this kingdom and that of Denmark, provided no further ill treatment be offered to the Queen Matilda.

They write from the Hague, that his Prussian Majesty has at this time an army consisting of 50,000 infantry, and 7,000 cavalry, fit for immediate action.

B O S T O N, June 29.

We hear that Orders are received from General Gage, for the 14th Regiment, now at Castle William, to hold themselves in readiness to be removed.

W I L L I A M S B U R G, July 2.

The storm of wind and hail, which fell last Thursday evening, has ruined many fields of wheat, and greatly damaged the young corn, in several counties up James river, as well as in New Kent and Gloucester; a number of houses were likewise thrown down on several plantations, and windows broke to pieces by the hailstones, which were remarkably large.

N E W - Y O R K, July 6.

Capt. Prince, in the Brig Liberty, in his way from Cayenne, in five weeks and two days, touched at Barbados, where he was informed, that the ship Bristol Packet, loaded with 350 hogheads of rum, besides sugar, bound for Bristol, was, on the 2d of June, burnt to the water's edge, in Carlisle Bay, by means of a loaded vessel coming out of a hoghead with a lighted candle in his hand. The 23d of June, Capt. Prince spoke with a sloop from South Carolina, for Cape Nicholls Mole, straight, Malter, in Lat. 28, Long. 67, 40, eleven days out; same day with Capt. Edward Scott, in a sloop from Cape Fear for Jamaica, twelve days out, and on the coast with a whaler, who acquainted him, that a few days before he fell in with a sloop vessel, whose bottom appeared to be newly paid with pitch; the same whaler spoke with a brig from this port, bound for Jamaica, but did not learn the Captain's name.

A brig from Wilmington, in Pennsylvania, was arrived at St. Kitts, that had made a voyage from that island to the continent, and back again, in Forty Days.

Last Wednesday morning arrived here the remainder of the 3d division of the Royal Americans, under the command of Colonel Prevost.

Saturday afternoon the Earl of Halifax packet, Capt. Boldarion, sailed with the mail for Falmouth.

P H I L A D E L P H I A, July 6.

By a letter from Port au Prince, dated June 7, we are informed that the ship King George, Capt. Armstrong, bound from Virginia to Jamaica, belonging to Messrs. Hammer and Harvey, Merchants of Virginia, was lost on Plate-wreck: The captain and crew are saved.

Since Thursday last, five or six men have died by drinking cold water while they were very warm: These, and many other instances of the like nature, ought to warn people against using cold water alone, at this exceeding hot season.
