T is faid to be the opinion of some of our lawyers, that the act for the establishment of religious worthip in this prevince, made in the year 1701-2, is, for flup in this prevence, made in the year 1701-2, 18, 101 some reason or other, absolutely null and void. Now, I find that this act repeals the act of 1700, entitled, An AA for the Service of Almighty God, &c. But can a law be repealed by a witing, which is a meer dead letter? Can the act of 1701-2, void ab initis, repeal the & of 1700 ?- May it not, then, be a question, whether, upon a supposition of the nullity of the act of 1701-s, the act of 1700 is not now in full force !-

What is the act of 1700? Does it not impose the payment of 40 per poll on the people?-Does it give less power to the clergy; is it less oppressive to the people? Does it breathe a more benign and charitable spirit on Dissenters?—It is to be hoped, that those, who have an opportunity, will oblige the publick with at copy of this act in the Gazette; that we may be able to determine whether it will be worth our pains to de-stroy an old establishment, if we must be subject to another, perhaps not less exceptionable. And may we not expect from our lawyers, fuch of them especially as are our representatives, a full, frank, and explicit declaration of their sentiments upon both these acres? Surely, they will not, any longer, fuffer the people to be bewildered in doubt and perplexity; when it is in their power to give light to their fleps, and direct them to the right road.

Tell us not of the policy of suppressing opinions. That policy is hothing but trick and artifice, which would shut out truth from the eyes of a people in mat ters of important concern to them of a people cipe cially, who wish to pursue it; and defire nothing mure ardently than to be informed how to conduct them; felves with justice and propriety. Here, however, must enter my caveat against baranguing, as the proper mode of conveying instruction. It is, at beft, too parpalm upon us chicanery for argument; and, intead of advancing truth, is a powerful infliument of amulement and desusion; more especially, if we consider who make up the bulk of hearers upon these occasions No, let us have it in plain black and white; that we may weigh it with deliberation, exercise our judg-ments coolly upon it, and form our best conclusions upon the genuine merits of the question.
