The reason given by Spain for refusing to open the Missisppi is, that West Florida was a conquered country, by that nation, and therefore the court of Great-Britain had no right to insert in the treaty of beace with the United States the following clause: Article VIII. The navigation of the river Missisppi, from its fource to the ocean, shall for ever remain free and open to the subjects of Great-Britain, and the citizens of the United States.

When Mr. Jay was at Madrid, he had a commison from congress to offer an exclusive navigation of the river Millissippi for fifty years, provided Spain would vigorously assist America; that court took fo much time to consider this proposition that in the interim lord Cornwallis surrendered; a victory so happily fortunate to America, gave a new turn to her politics, and congress therefore immediately dispatched a messenger to their ambassador, signifying their pleasure that the matter should be suspend-
