If the last drop of my blood could serve the community of Sedan, it has a right to the facrifice, and this would cost me less than that which I now make, but at the moment when I foreice, by reasons that will not escape you, that my presence with you would tend only in a few days to bring you into danger, I ought to spare the city of Sedan the missortunes of which I should be the cause, and I think the bett means of serving it is by removing from it a man whom all the enemies of liberty have proscribed, who will never bow to any despotism, and who, penetrated with grief at being no longer able at present to be useful to his country, feels consolation only in the vows he puts up, that the facred cause of liberty and equality, whose holy name is profaned, if that be pollible, by the crimes of a faction, may not at least be held long in subjection, and in the oath which he renews before a community truly patriotic, to be faithful to the principles that have animated his whole life. " LA FAYETTE." (Signed)

A L B A N Y, October 18, 1792. Yesterday was brought to town and lodged in gaol Jacob Valentine, the person charged with the marder of an Indian chief, some time since, at the Olwegofalls-and for whose apprehension the supreme executive of this state had, by proclamation, offered a reward of 500 dollars. He denies his having murdered the Indian, but says he killed him in his own detence -and that, at the time he was apprehended, he was on his way to deliver himself up for trial. He was taken in the state of Vermont, by Mr. Jonathan Russel, of Herkemer county, whither he had pursued him from Upper to Lower Canada, and across the Lakes. Mr. Russel, when in Upper Canada, applied to governor Simcoe for permission to apprehend the faid Valentine, if in that province, which was readily granted.
