ORDERED, That the aft to appoint an agent for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, the year one thousand seven numered and ninery-eight, be published in the Maryland Gazette, at Annapois, the Federal Gazette, at Baltimore, the Herald, at Eathon, and in one of the George-town and Frederick-town papers, once in each week for the term of eight weeks. As ACT to appoint an agent for the year one thousand seven bundred and ninety-eight.

BE it enaled, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That William Marbury be agent of this state, to execute the trust and power reposed in him by virtue of this act, from the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, until the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine.

II. And be it enacted, That the faid agent superintend the collection of all arrearages and balances due from the tereral collectors of the respective counties within this flate, appointed fince the first day of January, seventeen hundred and eighty-three; and the faid agent is hereby authorifed and required to call upon the trea-turers of the respective shores for an accurate statement of all arrearages and balances due from such collectors, and such accounts shall be surnished by the faid treafurers accordingly.

III. And be it enalted, That the faid agent be authorifed to superintend the collection of balances due to the flate on the auditor's books, or on open account; and the faid agent shall have power to require payment cf, and, if necessary, to sue for and recover the same; and the said agent, with the approbation of the governor and council, may make composition with any such debtors, and take bonds to the state, with sufficient se-curity, and give time for payment, not exceeding two years from the first day of January, seventeen hundred and ninety-eight.

IV. And be it enalled. That the faid agent be authorifed to inperintend the collection of all monies due to the flate for naval duties, fines, penalties, forfeitures and americaments, and forfeited recognizances, and tor ordinary, retailers and marriage licences, and to require payment, and, if necessary, site for and recover the same; and the said agent may allow for insolvencies, and credit any money that the party is not chargeable with by law, and for his information of the law, he may take the advice of the attorney-general in writing. IV. And be it enalled, That the faid agent be autho-

V. And be it enaded, 'That whenever there shall be occasion to expose to public sale the-property of any collector, or his fecurities, by virtue of any execution already issued, or to be issued for this purpose, the said agent shall cause at least thirty days public notice to be given of such sale, and shall attend the same, and is it fall appear that there is danger of loning any part of the debt due to the flate, and not otherwise, shall pur-chase any property so exposed to sale for the use of the flate, in payment, or part payment, as the ease may be, of the arrearages due by the collectors, whose property may be so purchased, and that no purchase authorised by this act shall be confidered as made on the part of the flate, unless a public declaration to that effect be the flate, unless a public declaration to that effect be made by the sgent, or his deputy, immediately after fuch fale and purchases, and any property so purchased for the use of the flate, the faid agent may again expose to public auction on the mast advantageous terms, for the use of the state, and if the same be fold on credit, which shall in no case exceed the term of two years, the faid agent shall take bond, with good and sufficient security; to be approved of by the treasurer of the western shore, from the purchasers of such property, and all bonds by him so taken shall be deposited, with an accurate list thereof subscribed by him, in the treasury of the western shore, and shall be a lien upon the real property of such purchasers, and their securities, from toperty of fuch purchafers, and their fecurities, from respective dates, or so much thereof as is mentioned

VI. X. And be it enaded, That if, under the terms of any compromite made as aforefaid, the property hereany compromite made as aforefaird, the property heretorore purchased should be taken back and resested in
the state, the same way be fold by the agent, and he is
hereby authorized and empowered to fell the same at
public sale, giving thirty days hotice, on a credit of two years, payable one half of the principal,
and the whole interest, annually, on the first day of
December in each year, and the bonds, when taken,
shall be returned to the treasury of the western shore,
and reported to the general assembly at their session
next ensuing the taking of such bonds.

XI. And be it enaded, That all cases in chancery, where no compromite under this act is effected, thall be placed under the direction of the agent, who is hereby authorited and tequired to call on the attorney-general to profecute or defend the same to immediate final decifion; and the governor and council are hereby aufhorifed and empowered, at the request of the agent, in cases of difficulty, to aid the attorney general, by employing any person to attend to surveys where necessary,

ploying any person to attend to surveys where necessary, or otherwise to assist in the prosecution or defence of faid suits, which person or persons are to be paid out of the contingent sund of five hundred pounds; and the names of the persons so employed, together with the sum allowed for their services, to be said before the general assembly at their next session.

XII. XVI. Addie it enalled. That the faid agent shall pay into the treasury, in specie, the smount of all specie by him received in the discharge of the duties of this act.

XVII. And be it enalled, That in all tales where bonds shall be taken in virtua; of this act, the bonds shall be a lien on all the real property of the obligors from the date, thereof, on on so much of the said real property as the governor and council shall think sufficient, to be particularly mentioned in a schedule to be annexed to the said bond, in which case it shall be a lien on the property contained in such schedule; and no more, such bond and schedule to be lodged with the treasurer of the western thore.

XVIII. And be it enalled! That all bonds then invirtue of this act thall express the county in which the

And be it enacted, That hereafter it shall be the duty of the lagent, and the treasurers of the western and eastern thores respectively, to receive, as well the fifteen per cent. interest, if any shall have account, as all other the arrearages that are now, or may hereafter become due from sines, sorfeitures and american entire arrearages. ments, ordinary, retailers, marriage, hawkers and ped-lers licences, and which fifteen per cents to collected, shall be the only fund out of which the agent shall draw his commission of three per cents, for collecting the same; provided that the said agent shall not be endiled to any commission upon the monies arising from fines, forfeitures, amerciaments, ordinary, retailers, matriage, hawkers and pedders hiences, unless in cases where the same shall not be paid by the sheriffs and clerks respectively, to the treasurer, within the month after the time prescribed by law, and unless the said agent shall thereaster receive the same from the said effects respectively, and the same pay to the said treasurer. XXIII. And be it exacted, That the said agent, before he enters upon the execution of the duties of this act, shall give bond to the state, before the governor and council, in the penalty of fixty thousand dollars, with such security as the governor and council shall approve, for the faithful performance of the said duties, which bond shall be lodged with the treasurer of the western titled to any commission upon the monies arising from
