ORDERED, That the act to appoint an agent for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, be published in the Maryland Gazette, at Annapolis, the Federal Gazette, at Baltimore, the Herald, at Easton, and in one of the George-town and Frederick-town papers, once in each week for the term of eight weeks.

An ACT to affinit an agent for the year one thousand seven bundred and ninesy-eight.

BE it enalted, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That William Marbury be agent of this state, to execute the trust and power reposed in him by virtue of

execute the first and power reposed in him by white of this act, from the first day of January, one thouland feven hundred and ninety-eight, until the first day of January, one thouland seven hundred and ninety-nine.

If. And he is enalled, That the said agent superintend the collection of all arrearages and balances due from the several collectors of the respective counties within this state, appointed since the first day of January, several and each of the three and the first and several collectors. venteen hundred and eichty-three; and the faid agent is hereby authorifed and required to call upon the treaturers of the respective shores for an accurate statement of all arrearages and balances due from such collectors, and fuch accounts shall be furnished by the faid trea-

futers accordingly.

III. And be it enalled, That the faid agent be authorised to superintend the collection of balances due to the state on the auditor's books, or on open account; and the faid agent shall have power to require payment of, and, if necessary, to sue for and recover the same; and the said agent, with the approbation of the governor and council, may make composition with any such debtors, and take bonds to the state, with sufficient security, and give time for payment, not exceeding two years from the first day of January, seventeen hundred

and ninety-eight.

IV. And be it enaded, That the faid agent be autho-IV. and be'it enabled, That the faid agent be authorifed to imperint and the collection of all monies due to the flate for naval duties, fines, penalties, forfeitures and amerciaments, and forfeited recognizances, and for ordinary, retailers and marriage licences, and to require payment, and, it needflary, fue for and recover the fame; and the land agent may allow for infolvences, and credit any money that the party is not chargeable with ty law, and for his information of the law, he may take the advice of the attorney-general in writing.

writing.

V. And be it enacted, That whenever there shall be occasion to expose to public fale the property of any collector, or his securities, by virtue of any execution already issued, or to be issued for this purpose, the said agent finds cause at least thirty days public notice to be given of such tale, and shall attend the same, and if it shall appear that there is danger of losing any part of the debt due to the stare, and not otherwise, shall purchase any property so exclosed to sale for the use of the chase any property so excosed to sale for the use of the state, in payment, or part payment, as the case may be, of the arreatages due by the collectors whose property may be so purchased, and that no purchase authorized by this act shall be considered as made on the part of the state, unless a public declaration to that effect be made by the agent, or his deputy, immediately after such sale and purchases and any property so purchased for the use of the state, the said agent may again expose to public auction on the most advantageous terms, for the use of the state, and if the same be fold on credit, which shall in no case exceed the term of two years, the the use of the state, and if the same be sold on creati, which shall in no case excred the term of two years, the said agent shall take bond, with good and sufficient security, to be approved of by the treasurer of the western shore, from the purchasers of such property, and all bonds by him so taken shall be deposited, with an accurate lift thereof subscribed by him, in the treasury of the western shore, and shall be a lien upon the real property of such purchasers, and their securities, from the respective dates, or so much thereof as is mentioned in the schedule thereto approved.

VI. And be it enacled, That the said agent is hereby directed to dispose of all conficated British property that remains unfold, and take bonds to the state, with sufficient security, and give time for the payment thereof, not exceeding two years from the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and that where the quantity of land in any one body fub-jest to such sale exceeds the quantity of fifty acces, such land shall be disposed of at public sale, of the time and place of which fale at least thirty days previous notice shall be given by public advertisement; and that at the time of any sale by virtue of this act, the said agent that make known that he only fells the right of this flate thereto, and that the flate doth not guaranty the title to the fame, or any part thereof, but that the purchase much be in all respects at the risk of the purchase

VII. And be it enadled, That no payment in future by any officer or person indebted to the state shall be valid and effectual. unless made to the treasurer of the western or extern side, or to the agent for the time being, or unless made to the clerks and sheriffs of the

feveral counties, in the cales where the faid clarks and therificate, in the cales where the faid clarks and therificate, by law authorited to receive the fame.

VIII. And he it enadled, That the agent thall have full power and authority, by and with the advice of the governor and council, in all cases of uninstalled debts, to tack any property heretosore, purchased by any person and to take any property heretosore, purchased by any person and to governor and council, and his seturities, are not capable of paying for the same, and to compromise the same of paying for the fame, and to compromife the fame upon terms and principles of equity and justice, by and

with the advice and confent aforefaid , and the agent is hereby required to lay a particular flatement of his proceedings under this fection before the next fession

of affembly.

1X. And be it enalled, That the agent, with the approbation and confent of the governor and council, be and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to comprome the state of the nor flate. mise any suitorieu and empowered to compromise any suit depending in chancery with any state debtor, upon any terms in their judgment calculated to promote the interest of the state, and to obtain the speedy receipt of the sums due.

X. And be it enaded, That if, under the terms of any compromile made as aforefaid, the property heretoire purchased should be taken back and revested in the state, the same may be sold by the agent, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to sell the same at public sale, giving thirty days notice, on a cre-dit of two years, payable one half of the principal, and the whole interest, annually, on the first day of December in each year, and the bonds, when taken, shall be returned to the treasury of the western shore, and reported to the general assembly at their session next entuing the taking of such bonds.

XI. And be it enalled, That all cases in chancery, where no compromise under this act is effected, shall be allowed under the displace of the agent as the session of the session chancery.

XIII. And be it enasted, That the said agent be authorised to superintend the collection of all balances due on bond taken for taxes due before the first day of January, seventeen hundred and eighty three; and the said agent shall also superintend the collection of all balances due on bonds installed, or otherwise, for the emissions of paper money of seventeen hundred and sixty nine, and seventeen hundred and seventy-three.

XIV. And be it enaded, That no process shall iffue against any of the public debtors, unless by the direction of the faid agent.

XV. And be it enacled, That the faid agent shall have

power to fix such days of sale of property taken by fieri sacias, at the suit of the state, as he may think proper, always taking care to give at leaft twenty days proper, always taking care to give at leaft twenty days public notice thereof; and the faid agent shall also have power to suspend the sales, from time to time, as he may think most to the advantage of the state.

XVI. And be it enalled, That the sale agent shall pay into the reasury, in specie, the amount of all specie by him received in the discharge of the duties of this act.

XVII. ind be it enalled, That in all cases where bonds shall be taken in virtue of this act, the bonds shall be a lien on all the real property of the obligors.

shall be a lien on all the real property of the obligors from the date thereof, or on so much of the said real property as the governor and council shall think sufficient, to be particularly mentioned in a schedule to he annexed to the said bond, in which case it shall be a

lien on the property contained in such schedule, and no more, such bond and schedule to be lodged with the treasurer of the western shore.

XVIII. And be it enaded, That all bonds taken in virtue of this act shall express the county in which the obligors respectively reside, and the treasurer of the western shore staged, within one month after he resident and the stage of the western shore staged, saying them with the schedule and them respectively, cause them, with the schedule annexed to them, to be recorded in the office of the clerk of the general court of the western shore, at the expence of the obligors; and a copy of the laid record, certified under the hand and official leal of the faid clerk, shall be as good evidence in any court of law or equity in this state as the original bond would be if it was produced; and if any of the obligors in any such bonds reside on the eastern shore, the said treasurer shall, within six months from the time he receives the same of the eaftern fhore, in the fame manner as papers on public fervice are transmitted, a copy of such bonds and schedules, certified as asoresaid by the clerk of the general court of the western shore, to be recorded in the office of the clerk of the general court of the eastern shore, at the expence of the obligors, and in such cale a copy of the faid record, certified as aforefaid by the clerk of the general court of the eastern shore,

XIX. And be it exacted. That the faid agent shall render to the treasurer of the western shore distinct quarder to the transfer of the wentrn inote difficates and bonds, in virtue of this act; and hall immediately thereupon pay and deliver the fame to the fall treasurer, who shall, in his annual report to the general allembly, that fully and particularly the money, certificates and bonds, by him received from the faid agent, and the times when the fame accounted for times when the fame were received and accounted for.

XX. And be it enafled, That the faid agent shall render a fair and full account of his several proceedings under the authority of this act to the general assembly under the authority of this act to the general assembly at their next session, and within the first ten days after its commencement, in which account shall be specified, under distinct heads, his own receipts, and those of the treasurer, and of all transfers of stock upon which he may be entitled to commission, and in which shall also be contained a particular estimate of his commissions, diesing how and upon what the same arose due.

XXI. And be it enacted, That the said agent shall be allowed for his services the following commissions, to wit i for all payments actually made to either of the treasurers in virtue of this act, three per cent, and for all bonds with security taken by the said agent in virtue of this act, three per cent, provided that the whole

of this act, three per cent, provided that the whole amount of his commission shall not exceed five hundred pounds current money, and he shall lay an account of the same, on oath, before the next session of assembly.

XXII. And be it enacted, That hereaster it shall be the duty of the agent, and the treasurers of the western and eastern shores respectively.

tern and eastern shores respectively, to receive, as well the fifteen per cent. interest, if any shall have accrued, as all other the arrearages that are now, or may here-atter become due from sines, forseitures and americaafter become due from fines, forfeitures and amerciaments, ordinary, retailers, marriage, hawkers and pedlers licences, and which fifteen per cent. fo collected, shall be the only, fund out of which the agent shall draw his commission of three per cent. for collecting the same; provided that the said agent shall not be entitled to any commission upon the monies arising from sines, forfeitures, amerciaments, ordinary, retailers, marriage, hawkers and pedlers licences, unless in cases where the same shall not be paid by the sherists and clerks respectively, to the treasurer within one month after the time prescribed by law, and unless the said agent shall thereaster receive the same from the said officers respectively, and the same pay to the said treasurer.

XXIII. And be it enacted, That the said agent, before he enters upon the execution of the duties of this act, shall give bond to the state, before the governor and council, in the penalty of fixty thousand dollars, with founds, in the penalty of fixty thouland dollars, with such fecurity as the governor and council finall approve, for the taithful performance of the faild duties, which bond shall be lodged with the treasurer of the western shore, and shall also take an oath before the chancellor, that he will well and faithfully discharge the duties as agent under the act, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, to the best of his skill and judgment, the certificate of which oath shall be annexed to, or endorsed on, the said boud. dorfed on, the faid boud.

XXIV. And be it enacted, That if the faid agent shall

not accept his appointment, or if after his acceptance he shall not give bond, and take the oath aforesaid, be-fore the first day of February next, or shall die, the governor and council are hereby authorifed and requested to appoint a fit and proper p-rion in his place, who shall have and execute all the authorities and powers vested in the said William Marbury by this act, such person first giving security, and taking the oath

## LONDON, December 20.

LETTER from Rastadt, dated 1st December, fays, "When the Swedish ambassador, count Ferion, fent his card to general Buonaparte, the latter answered, " I do not know him, nor will I fee him." Count Ferson was formerly colonel in the French guards and a favourite of the late queen, he made feveral fruitless attempts to rescue her from confine-ment. It was by order of the French Directory that Buonaparte returned the above answer. Count Metternich, the Imperial plenipotentiary, who passed yesterday through Augsburg, is expected here to-morrow; his arrival in this city has, we understand, been prevented from a point of eliquette, the Imperial court having entertained a wish that the French plenipotentiaries thould arrive here fooner than the Imperial minister. Hopes are entertained here, that the congress will become general, and that Great-Britain, Spain and Holland, will send plenipotentiaries to open negotiations for a general peace. The Margrave of Baden has presented general Buonaparte with a beautiful carriage. On the part of the Hanseatic cities Hamburg, Lubeck, and Bremen, Messire. Dorman, Robbe, and Gaoning, are arrived here. The report of an important change intended to be made at the congress, in regard of these cities is without founda-
