W HEREAS the holding elections at any one place in each county of this flate is attended with great inconvenience to all citizens remote from faid piace, and perates to deprive many persons entitled to la Frage from the exercise of that right; and as it is defirable that the ul, free, and fair voice of the people thould be expressed in their choice of the

functionaries of government,

Be it enauced, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the everal counties of this state, for the purpose of halling all future elections to delegates, electors of the lengte, and sheriffs of the leveral counties, shall be divided into segarate diffricts in tite anner herein after directed, viz Saint Mary's county shall be divided and laid off into three feparate diffricts, Kent county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Calvert county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Charles county shall be divided and laid off into four separate diltricts, Talbot county shall be divided and laid off into four separate districts, Somerset county shall be divided and laid off into three feparate diffricte, Dorchefter county fhall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Coest county shall be divided and laid off into four separate districts, Prince George's county shall be divided and laid off into five separate dittricts, Queen Anne's county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Worceiter county shair be divided and laid off into five separate districts, brederick county shall be divided and laid off into feven separate dittricts, Harfird county shall be divided and laid off into five leparate districts, Caroline county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Washington county shall be divided and laid off into five separate diftrifts, Montgomery county shall be divided and laid off into five reparate diffriers, Allegany county shall be divi led and laid off into fix f. parate diffricts.

And be it enacted, That before any of the persons aforesaid shall be admitted as a witness in any court of justice in this state, the court shall be satisfied, by such testimony as they may require, that such person is one or those who profess to be conscientiously icrurulous of
