WHEREAS by an all of congress, palled on the fixteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hunred and ninety-eight, the president of the United States is authorised to borrow, on behalf of the United States, from the bank of the United States, or from any other body or bodles politic or corporate, or from any perfon or persons, and upon such terms and conditions as he thall judge most advantageous for the United States, a sum not exceeding five millions of dollarsfo, however, that no contract or engagement he made which shall preclude the United States from reimharfing any fum or fums horrowed, at any time after the expiration of fifteen years from the date of fuch And subcreas it is declared by the faid act, that so much as may be necessary of the surplus of the duties on imports and tunnage, beyond the permanent appropriations heretofore charged upon them by law, shall be pledged and appropriated for paying the interest, and also for paying and ducharging the principal sum or sums of all the monies which may be borrowed, according to the term or terms which may be fixed, pursuant to the authority aforesaid—And aubereas by the said act, the faith of the United States is pledged to establish sufficient permanent revenues for making up any deficiency that may hereaster appear in the provisions before mentioned for paying the interest and principal sums, or either of them, of any monies which may be borrowed pursuant to the faid And whereas the prefident of the United States did by an act or commission under his hand dated the ninth day of January in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, authorise and empower the fecretary of the treasury, to borrow on behalf of the United States, any fum not exceeding in the whole, five millions of dollars, and to make fuch contract or contracts as should be necessary, and for the interest of the United States, in pursuance of the act of congress above recited.

Now therefore, the underfigned, fecretary of the treasury, in pursuance of the act of congress, and the authority from the president of the United States, above mentioned, doth hereby, on behalf of the United States of America, contract and engage in manner following, to wit:

1st. A book for receiving subscriptions to a loan of five millions of dollars for the use of the United States shall be opened in the city of Philadelphia, at the bank of the United States, on Thursday the twenty-eighth day of February ensuing, which book shall continue open for the purpose of receiving sub-feriptions, until the whole of the said five millions of dollars shall be subscribed. If more than five millions of dollars shall be subscribed on the first day of opening the said loan, the surplus shall be deducted in proportion to the fums subscribed by individuals, exceeding four thousand dollars.

2d. For every hundred dollars which may be fubfcribed, there shall be forthwith deposited and paid the fum of twelve dollars and fifty cents, and like payments of twelve dollars and fitty cents, shall be made within the first ten days of the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, and October en-fuing. The fecretary of the treasury, however, re-ferves the right of reducing the number of inhalments by special agreements, with the individuals who may become subscribers.

31. On the failure of payment of any inflalment of the fums subscribed according to the tenor of the fecond article, the next preceding inftalment of twelve dollars and fifty cents, which shall have been paid, for every hundred dollars subscribed, shall be fortested to the United States.
