An ACT to alter, a lift and repeal, certain parts of the tonstitution and form of government of this state as are therein mentioned.

HEREAS the holding elections at any one place in each county of this state is attended with great inconvenience to all citizens remote from faid place, and operates to deprive many persons entitled to suffrage from the exercise of that right; and as it is defirable that the full, free and tair voice of the people should be expressed in their choice of the

functionaries of government,

II. Be it enaded, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the several counties of this state, purpose of holding all suture elections for delegates, electors of the senate, and sheriffs of the several counties, shall be divided into separate districts in the manner herein after directed, viz. Saint-Mary's county shall be divided and laid off into three separte districts, Kent county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Calvert county shall be divided and laid off into three ieparate diffriets, Charles county shall be divided and laid off into sour separate districts, Talbot county shall be divided and laid off into four separate districts, Somerset county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Dorchester county shall be divided and laid off into three separate diffricts, Czeil county shall be divided and laid off into four separate districts, Prince-George's county shall be divided and laid off into five separate districts, Queen Anne's county shall be divided and off into three separate districts, Worcester county shall be divided and laid off into five separate diffriets, Frederick county shall be divided and laid off into seven separate districts, Harford county shall be divided and laid off into five separate districts, Caroline county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Washington county shall be divided and laid off into five separate districts, Montgomery county shall be divided and laid off into five separate diffricts, Allegany county shall be divided and laid off into fix separate diftrias.

III. And be it enaded, That Anne-Arundel county, including the city of Annapolis, shall be divided and

laid off into five separate districts.

IV. And be it enacted, That Baltimore county, out of the limits of the city of Baltimore, shall be divided and laid off into seven districts, and that the city of Baltimore shall be laid off into eight districts.

V. And be it enacted, That all and every part of the conflitution and form of government relating to the judges, time, place and manner, of holding elections in the city of Baltimore, and all and every part of the fecond, third, fifth, fourteenth and forry-fecond fec-tions of the conflitution and form of government of this state, which relate to the judges, place, time and manner of holding the feveral elections for delegates, electors of the fenate, and theriffs of the feveral countics, be and the same are hereby abrogated, repealed and annulled, and the same shall hereaster be regulated

by law. VI. 'And be it enacled, That if this act shall be confirmed by the general affembly, after the next election or delegates, in the first fession after such new election, as the constitution and form of government directs, faid conflitution contained therein, shall be considered as a part, and shall constitute and be valid as a part, of the faid constitution and form of government, to all intents and purposes, any thing therein contained to

.IV. And be it enaded, That Baltimore county, out of the limits of the city of Baltimore, shall be divided and laid off into feven districts, and that the city of Baltimore shall be laid off into eight districts.

V. And be it enadled, That all and every part of the conflitution and form of government relating to the judges, time, place and manner, of holding elections, in the city of Baltimore, all and every part of the fecond, third, fifth, fourteenth and forty fecond fections of the conflitution and form of government of this state, as also every part of the faid constitution and form of government which relate to the judges, place, time and manner, of holding the feveral elections for delegates, electors of the fenate, and sheriffs or the feveral counties, be and the same are hereby abrogated, repealed and annulled, and the same shall

hereafter be regulated by law.

VI. And be it enaded, That no person peffessing the qualification of property required by the constitution shall be entitled to vote at any election to be held for sheriffs, delegates to the general assembly, or electors of the fenate, unless there be some written evidence that he is worth thirty pounds, or a freehold of fifty acres of land, at the time he offers to vote, this written evidence to be an affessment of property to that amount, which affeliment may be made at any time before such person offers to vote, upon his producing fatisfactory testimony of his possessing such property; the manner of making out such assessment, and the person or persons to judge of the qualification as to property, to be hereafter regulated by law.

VII. And be it enasted, That all parts of the con-

flitution and form of government not herein before enumerated, which are repugnant to, and inconsistent with, the provisions of this act, be and the same are

with, the provided annualled and avoided.

VIII. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the general assembly, after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the conflitution and form of government directs, that in fuch case this act, and the alteration of the faid constitution contained therein, shall be confidered as a part, and shall constitute and be valid as a part, of the faid conflitution and form of government, to all intents and purpoles, any thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
