An ACT to alter, abolish and repeal, certain parts of the consitution and form of government of this flate as are therein mentioned.

HEREAS the holding elections at any one with great inconvenience to all citizens remote from faid place, and operates to deprive many persons entitled to fuffrage from the exercise of that right; and as it is defirable that the full, free and tain voice of the people should be expressed in their choice of the

functionaries of government,

Il Be it enasted, by the General Assembly of Mary. land, That the leveral counties of this state, for the purpose of holding all suture elections for delegates, electors of the fenate, and fheriff, of the feveral counties, fhah be divided into feparate diffriels in the manner herein after directed, viz. Saint Mary's county theil be divided and laid off into three separte diffricts, Rent county shall be divided and laid off into three sparare diffricts, Calvert county shall be divided and laid off into three leparate districts, Charles county shall be divided and laid off into four feparate diffriets, Taibot county shall be divided and laid off into four feparate diftrifts, Somerfet county fhall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Dorchester county shall be divided and laid off into three separate diffricts, Cæcil county finall be divided and laid off into four separate diffricts Prince George's county shall be divided and laid off into five separate districts, Queen Anne's county shall be divided and off into three separate districts, Worcester county shall be divided and laid off into five teparate districts, Frederick county shall be divided and laid off into seven separate districts, Harford county shall be divided and laid off into five leparate districts, Caroline county shall be divided and laid off into three separate districts, Washington county shall be divided and laid off into five feparate districts. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the general affembly, after the next election of delegates, in the first fession after such new election, as the constitution and form of government directs, that in such case this act, and the alteration of the faid conflitution contained therein, shall be confidered as a part, and shall constitute and be valid as a part, of the faid conflitution and foim of government, to all intents and curpofes, any thing therein contained to

the contrary notwithstanding.

III. And be it enafled, That Anne-Arundel county, including the city of Annapolis, shall be divided and laid off into five separate districts.

IV. And be it enacled, That Baltimore county, out of the limits of the city of Baltimore, shall be divided and laid off into feven dittricts, and that the city of Baltimore shall be laid off into eight diffricts.

V. And be it enacted, That all and every part of the constitution and form of government relating to the judges, time, place and manner, of holding elections, in the city of Baltimore, all and every part of the fecond, third, fitth, fourteenth and forty fecond fections of the confliction and form of government of this flate, as also every part of the said confliction and form of government which relate to the judges, place, time and manuer, of holding the several elections for delegates, electors of the fenate, and fheriffs of the several counties, be and the same are hereby abrogated, repealed and annulled, and the fame shall

herea ter be regulated by law.

VI And is it enacled, That no person possessing the qualification of property required by the constitution thall be entitled to vote at any election to be held for sheriffs, delegates to the general affembly, or electors of the fenate, unless there be some written evidence that he is worth thirty pounds, or a freehold of filey acres of land, at the time he offers to vote, this written evidence to be an affesiment of property to that amount, which effeffment may be made at any time before fuch person offers to vote, upon his producing fatisfactory tellimony of his possessing such property; the manner of making out fuch affessment, and the person or persons to judge of the qualification-as to property, to be hereafter regulated by law.

VII. And be it enaded, That all parts of the con-

flitution and form of government not herein before. enumerated, which are repugnant to, and inconfiltent with, the provisions of this act, be and the fame are

hereby repealed, annulled and avoided.

VIII. And be it enaded, That if this aft shall be confirmed by the general assembly, after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the constitution and form of government that in fuch cafe this act, and the alteration of the faid conflitution contained therein, shall be confidered as a part, and shall constitute and be valid as a part, of the faid conflitution and furm of government, to all intents and purpoles, any thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
