ORDERED, That the act, entitled, An act pregribing the form of the bond to be hereafter given by the clerks of the feveral counties of this flate, and An at to appoint an agent for the year one thousand eight hundred and one, be published once in each week, for the term of eight weeks, in the Maryland Gazette at Annapolis, the Federal Gazette at Baltimore, the Wathington Federalist, and in Mr. Cowan's paper at

La ACT to appoint an agent for the year one thousand tight hundred and one.

B it enasted, by the general Assembly of Maryland,
That Henry Hall Harwood be agent of this state, Dexecute the truft and power repoled in him by virthe of this act from the first day of January, one thoufand eight and one, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and two.

II. And be it enalled, That the faid agente superintend the collection of all arrearages and balances due from the several collectors of the respective counties within this state, and the said agent is hereby authorifed and required to call upon the treasurers of the respective shores for an accurate flatement of all arrearages and balances due from fuch collectors, and fuch account shall be furnished by the faid treasurers accord-

III. And be it exacted, That the faid agent be authorifed to superintend the collection of balances due to the state on the auditor's books or on open account; and the faid agent shall have power to require payment of, and, if necessary, to sue for and recover the same; and the faid agent, with the approbation of the goeraor and council, may make composition with any sch debtors, and take bonds to the state, with fuffrient fecurity, and give time for payment, not exrecling two years from the first day of January, one housend eight hundred and one.

W. And be it cualled, That the faid agent be autho-ifed to superintend the collection of all monies due o the flate for naval duties, fines, penalties, forfeitures ad amerciaments, and forfeited recognizances, and er ordinary, retailers and marriage licences, and to equire payment, and (if necessary) fue for and reover the fame; and the faid agent may allow for inbluencies, and credit any money that the party is not thargeable with by law, and, for his information of he law, he may take the advice of the attorney-ge-

V. And be it enaded, That whenever there shall be custion to expose to public sale the property of any collector, or his securities, by virtue of any execution dready iffeed, or to be iffeed for this purpole, the faid rest shall cause at least thirty days public notice to be given of such sale, and shall attend the same, and sit shall appear that there is danger of losing any part of the debt due to the state, and not otherwise, shall unchile any property to exposed to fale for the use of he flate, in payment, or part payment, as the cale my be, of the arrearages due by the collectors whole riperty may be so purchased, and that no purchase suborised by this act shall be considered as made on the purt of the slate, unless a public declaration to that after fuch fale and purchase; and any property so pur-tified for the use of the flate, the said agent may gain expose to public auction, on the most advanageous terms for the use of the state, and, if the same be fold on credit, which shall in no case exceed the term of two years, the faid agent thall take bond, with 200d and fufficient fecurity, to be approved of by the Besser of the waltern thore, from the purchasers of sech property, and all bonds by him so taken shall be de-posted, with an accurate lift thereof subscribed by him, is the tresfury of the western shore, and shall be a lien apon the real property of fuch purchasers, and their curities, from the respective dates, or so much there-

VI. And be it enalted, That the faid agent is hereby directed to dispose of all conficated. Birtish property that remains unfold, and take bonds to the state, with follower feourity, and give time for the payment thereof, not exceeding two years from the first day of: lanuary, one shouland eight hundred and one; and that when the quantity of land in any one, body fublet to fuch fele, exceeds the quentity of fifty acres, such land shall be disposed of an public fale, of the line and place of which fale at least thirty days pretions notice shall be given by public advertisment; and that at the time of any sale by virtue of this act, the said agent shall make known that he only fells the light of this flate thereto, and that the flate doth not burning the title of the fame, or any parethereof, but at the purchase must be in all respects at the sife of the purchaser.

VII. And be it enalled, That no payment in future by any efficer or person indebted to the flate shall be

in the cases where the faid clerks and fhariffs are by

law authorifed to receive the fame.

VIII. And be it enaded. That the agent shall have full power and authority, by and with the advice of the governor and council; in all cases of uninstalled debts, to take back any property heretofore purchased by any person and not yet paid for, in cases where the person so having purchased, and his securities, are storaged to the person of paying for the form and he countries. capable of paying for the same, and to compromise the fame upon terms and principles of equity and justice, by and with the advice and confent aforefaid; and the agent is bereby required to lay a particular flatement of his proceedings under this fection before the next fellion of affembly.

IX. And he it enalled, That the agent, with the approbation and confent of the governor and council, be and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to com-promife any fuit depending in chancery with any flate debtor, upon any terms in their judgment calculated to promote the interest of the flate, and to obtain the

fpeedy receipt of the fums due.

X. And be it enalled, That if, under the terms of any compromise made as aforesaid, the property bere-tosore purchased shall be taken back and revested in the state, the same may be sold by the agent, and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to tell the fama at public fale, giving thirty days notice, on a credit of two years, payable, one half of the principal, and the whole interest annually, on the first day of December in each year; and the bonds, when taken, shall be returned to the treasury of the western shore, and re-ported to the general assembly at their session next enfuing the taking of fuch bonds.

XI. And be it enadled, That all cases in chancery, where no compromise under this act is effected, shall be placed under the direction of the agent, who is hereby anthorised and required to call on the attorneygeneral to profecute or defend the same to immediate final decifion; and the governor and council are hereby authorifed and empowered, at the request of the agent, in cases of difficulty, to aid the attorney-general, by employing any person to attend to surveys where necessary, or otherwise to assist in the profecution or defence of faid fuits, which person or perfons are to be paid out of the contingent fund of five hundred pounds; and the names of the persons to em-ployed, together with the sum allowed for their ser-vices, to be laid before the general assembly at their next fession.

Kil. And be it enacted, That if any bond debtor to the flate for confiscated property purchased, or otherwife, shall neglect to make payment, agreeably to the condition of his bond, and fundry resolves of the general affembly, the faid agent shall eause process to issue for the whole principal and interest then due, or shall proceed on any execution already issued, and ferved and suspended, as occasion may require, or, under the directions and with the approbation of the governor and council, he is hereby authorised to delay any execution as long as they may think expedient and necessary.

XIII. And be it enaded, That the faid agent be authorised to superintend the collection of all balances due on bond taken for taxes due before the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and eightythree; and the faid agent shall also superintend the collection of all balances due on bonds installed, or ortherwise, for the emissions of paper money of seventeen hundred and fixty-nine, and feventeen hundred

and seventy-thee.

XIV. And be it enaded, That no process shall issue against any of the public debtors, unless by the direction of the said agent.

XV. And be it englied, That the faid agent shall have power to fix fuch days of fale of property taken by fieri facias, at the fuit of the flate, as he may think, proper, always taking care to give at least thirty days public notice thereof, and the faid agent shall also have power to suspend the sales, from time to time, as he

may think most to the advantage of the state.

XVI. And be it enalled. That the said agent shall pay into the treasury, in specie, the amount of all specie by him received in the discharge of the duties of this act.

XVII. And be it enalled, That in all cases where bonds shall be taken in virtue of this act, the bonds fhall be a lien on the real property of the obligors from the date thereof, or on so much of the taid teal property so the governor and council shall think fufficient, to be particularly mentioned in a tchedule to be annexed to the faid bond, in which cafe it shall be a lies on the property contained in such schedule, and no more, fuch bond and schedule to be lodged with the treasurer of the western shore.

XVIII, And be it enaffed. That all bonde taken in virtue of this act shall express the county in which the oblights respectively reside, and the treasurer of the western shore shall, within one month after he receives them respectively, cause them, with the schedule an-

western or castern shore, or to the agent, or unless nexed to them, to be recorded in the office of the clerk made to the clerks and sheriffs of, the several country, of the general court of the western shore at the exof the general court of the western shore at the expence of the obligars; and a copy of the faid record, certified under the hand and official feal of the faid clerk, shall be as good evidence in any court of law of equity in this state as the original Bond would be if it was produced; and if any of the obligors in any fuch hands reside on the colors. fuch bonds refide on the eastern fhore, the faid treafurer shall, within fix months from the time he receives the same respectively, transmit to the clerk of the general court of the easiern shore, in the same manner as papers on public fervice are transmitted, a copy, of such bonds and schedules, certified as aforefaid by, the clerk of the general court of the western. shore, to be recorded in the office of the clerk of the general court of the eaflern shore, at the expense of the obligors, and, in such case, a copy of the said record, certified as aforefaid by the clerk of the general court of the eaftern shore, shall be good evidence as

XIX. And be it enaded, That the faid agent shall render to the treasurer of the western shore distinct quarterly accounts of his receipts of all money, certificates and bonds, in virtue of this act, and shall immediately thereupon pay and deliver the fame to the faid treasurer, who shall, in his annual report to the general assembly, state fully and particularly the money, certificates and bonds, by him received from the faid agent, and the times when the same were re-

ceived and accounted for.

XX. And be it eraded, That the faid agent shall render a fair and full account of his feveral proceedings, under the authority of this act, to the general affembly at their next fession, and within the first ten days after its commencement, in which account shall be freelied under did to the control his ten or realistic tenders did to the control his tenders and the freelies. be specified, under distinct heads, his own receipts, and those of the treasurer, and of all transfers of stock upon which he may be entitled to commission, and in which shall also be contained a particular estimate of his commissions, shewing how and upon what the

XXI. And be it enaded, That the faid agent fhall, within twenty days after the commencement of the next fession of the general assembly, render to each branch of the legislature a fair and distinct account of the debts or sums of money due to the state, arranging the names of the debtors in alphabetical order, and give full and complete information of the manner in which, and the time when, each debt arofe, and also the different fleps and proceedings which have been taken by himself, or others, for the recovery there-

of.

XXII. And be it enalled, That the faid agent thall

following commissions. be allowed for his fervices the following commissions, to wit: For all payments actually made to either of the treasurers in virtue of this act, three fer cent. and for all bonds taken by the faid agent in virtue of this

act, three per cent.

XXIII. And be it enasted, That the faid agent, before he enters upon the execution of the duties of this act, shall give bond to the state, before the governor and council, in the penalty of fixty thousand dollars, with fuch fecurity as the governor and council shall approve, for the faithful performance of the faid du-ties, which bond shall be lodged with the treasurer of the western shore, and shall also take an oath, before the chancellor, that he will well and faithfully difcharge the duties as agent, under the act, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year eighteen hundred and one, to the best of his skill and judgment; the certificate of which oath shall be annexed to, or endorsed on, the faid bond.

XXIV. And be it enacted, That the agent be and he is hereby authorifed and directed to collect any fum or fums of money due from persons residents without the state of Maryland, and, if necessary, sue therefor, and he is also authorised to employ counsel for the recovery of the same, and give such see as he may think reafonable, and draw on the treasurer of the western shore therefor, who is hereby authorised to pay the amount

XXV. And be it enalled, That if the faid agent shall not accept his appointment, or if after his acceptance he shall not give bond, and take the oath aforesaid, before the first day of February next, or shall die, the governor and council are hereby authorised and requested to appoint a sit and proper person in his place, who shall have and execute all the authorities and powers vested in the said agent by this act, such perfon first giving security and taking the cath afore-

XXVI. Provided always, and be it enaffed, That the faid agent shall not be entitled to any commission upon any monies stifing from sines, forfeitures, amereiaany monies atting from tings, fortettiers, emerciaments, ordinary, retailers, matriage, lisawhers and
pedders licences, unless in cales where the same shall
not be paid by the sheriffs and clerks respectively to
the treasurer within one mouth after the time prescribed
by law, and unless the fald agent shall there from
ceive the same from the said officers respectively, and
the same pay to the said treasurer.
