Is ACI to appoint an agent for the year one thousand eight bundred and one.

Be it enasted, by the general Assembly of Maryland, That Henry Hall Harwood be agent of this state, to exteute the trult and power repoled in him by virfind eight and one, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and two. -

II. And be it enalled. That the faid agent superin-tend the collection of all arrearages and balances due from the feveral collectors of the respective counties within this state, and the said agent is hereby authorifed and required to call upon the treasurers of therespective shores for an accurate statement of all arrearges and balances due from fuch collectors, and fuch acount thall be furnished by the faid treasurers accord-

ogly.
III. And be it enaded, That the faid agent be authoifed to superintend, the collection of balances due to te flate on the auditor's books or on open account ; and the faid agent shall have power to require payment f, and, if necessary, to fue for and recover the fame ; and the faid agent, with the approbation of the goich debtors, and take bonds to the flate, with fufcient fecurity, and give time for payment, not exeeding two years from the first day of January, one boulend eight hundred and one.

IV. And be it enafted, That the faid agent be autho-fed to superintend the collection of all monies due the fiste for naval duties, fines, penalties, forfeitures at amerciaments, and forfeited recognizances, and or ordinary, retailers and marriage licences, and to equire payment, and (if necessary) fue for and reover the same; and the said agent may allow for inbrencies, and credit any money that the party is not hargeable with by law, and, for his information of he law, he may take the advice of the attorney-ge-

eral in writing. ...

V. And be it enaded, That whenever there shall be ccasion to expose to public sale the property of any ollector, or his fecurities, by virtue of any execution ready issued, or to be issued for this purpose, the faid gent shall cause at least thirty days public notice to it thall appear that there is danger of loting any part. the debt due to the flate, and not otherwife, fhall archale any property to exposed to fale, for the use of he flate, in payment, or part payment, as the cale reperty may be so purchased, and that no purchase uthorised by this act shall be considered as made on the part of the state, unless a public declaration to that set be made by the agent or his deputy immediately fter fach fale and purchase ; and any property so purhiled for the use of the state, the said agent may Igous terms for the use of the state, and, if the same sold on credit; which shall in no case exceed the sum of two years, the said agent shall take houd, with ood and fufficient security, to be approved of by the ich property, and all bonds by him to taken thall be deofited, with an accurate Ilft thereof fubleribed by him, the treasury of the western shore, and shall be a lien pon the real property of fuch purchalers, and their cuities, from the respective dates, or so much there-

VI. And be is enacted. VIII. And be it enacted, That the agent final have full power and authority, by and with the advice of the governor and council, in all cases of uninstalled debts, to take back any property heretofore purchased by any person and not yet paid for, in cases where the person so having purchased, and his securities, are not capable of paying for the same, and to compromise the fame upon terms and principles of equity and juiles, by and with the advice and confent alors and the agent is hereby required to lay a particular flatement

of his proceedings under this fection before the next

fession of assembly.

IX. And be it enasted, That the agent, with the approbation and consent of the governor and council, be and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to compromile any fuit depending in chancery with any flate debtor, upon any terms in their judgment calculated to promote the interest of the state, and to obtain the

speedy receipt of the sums due.

X. And be it enacted, That is, under the terms of any compromise made as asoresaid; the property heretofore purchased shall be taken back and revested in the state, the same may be fold by the agent, and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to fell the same at public sale, giving thirty days notice, on a credit of two years, payable, one half of the principal, and the whole interest annually, on the first day of December in each year; and the bonds, when taken, shall be returned to the treasury of the western shore, and reported to the general affembly at their fession next en-

fuing the taking of fuch bonds.

XI. And be it enacied, That all cases in chancery, where no compromise under this act is effected, shall be placed under the direction of the agent, who is hereby authorised and required to call on the attorneygeneral to profecute or defend the same to immediate final decifion; and the governor and council are hereby authorifed and empowered, at the request of the agent, in cases of difficulty, to aid the attorney-general, by employing any person to attend to surveys where necessary, or otherwise to assist in the prolecution or defence of faid fuits, which person or perfons are to be paid out of the contingent fund of five hundred pounds; and the names of the persons to em-ployed, together with the sum allowed for their services, to be laid before the general affembly at their next feffion.

XII. And be it enafled. That if any bond debtor to the flate for confifcated property purchased, or other-wife, shall neglect to make payment, agreeably to the condition of his bond, and sundry resolves of the general affembly, the faid agent fhall cause process to issue for the whole principal and interest then due, or shall proceed on any execution already iffued, and ferved and suspended; as occasion may require, or, under the directions and with the approbation of the governor and council, he is hereby authorised to delay any execution as long as they may think expedient and necessary.

XIII. And be it enadled, That the faid agent be authorifed to superintend the collection of all balances due on bond taken for taxes due before the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and eightythree; and the said agent shall also superintend the collection of all balances due on bonds installed, or ortherwife, for the emissions of paper money of seven-teen hundred and fixty-nine, and seventeen hundred and feventy-three.

XIV. And be it enaded, That no process thall iffue against any of the public debtors, unless by the di-

rection of the fald agent.

XV. And be is enaffed, That the faid agent shall have power to fix fuch days of fale of property taken by fieri facias, at the fuit of the fiste, as he may think proper, always taking care to give at least thirty days public notice thereof, and the faid agent shall also bays power to suspend the fales, from time to time, as he

may think most to the advantage of the state.

XVI. And be it exasted, That the said agent shall pay into the treasury, in specie, the animum of all specie by him received in the discharge of the duties of this act.

XVII. And be it enaded. That in all cales where bonds (hall be taken in virtue of this act; the bonds shall be a lien on the real property of the obligora from the date thereof, or on fo much of the laid, real property as the governor and council fhall think fufficient, to be particularly mentioned in a schedule to be squezed to the faid bond, in which cale it shall be a lies on the property contained in such schedule, and no more, such bond and schedule to be lodged with the

treasurer of the wellern shore.

XVIII. Ind by it chasted, That all bonds taken in virtue of this act shall express the county in which the obligors respectively reside, and the treasurer of the western shore shall within one mouth alter he receives them respectively, cause them, with the schedule an-

wellern or eastern shore, or to the agent, or unless nexed to them, to be recorded in the office of the clerk made to the clerks and sheriffs of the several counties, of the general court of the wellern shore at the expence of the obligors; and a copy of the faid record, certified under the hand and official feel of the faith clerk, stiall be as good evidence in any court of law of equity in this flate as the original bond would be if it was produced; and if any of the obligors in any fuch bonds refide on the eastern shore, the said trea-surer shall, within fix months from the time he receives the same respectively, transmit to the clerk of the general court of the eastern shore, in the same manner as papers on public fervice are transmitted, a copy of such bonds and schedules, certified as afore-faid by the clerk of the general court of the western shore, to be recorded in the office of the clerk of the general court of the eastern shore, at the expense of the obligors, and, in such case, a copy of the said record, certified as aforesaid by the clerk of the general

court of the eastern thore, shall be good evidence as aforefald.

XIX. And be it snadled, That the faid agent shall render to the treasurer of the western shore distinct quarterly accounts of his receipts of all money, certificates and bonds, in virtue of this act, and shall im-mediately thereupon pay and deliver the same to the said treasurer, who shall, in his annual report to the general affembly, flate fully and particularly the money, certificates and bonds, by him received from the faid agent, and the times when the fame were re-

ceived and accounted for.

XX. And be it enaded, That the faid agent fhall render a fair and full account of his feveral proceedunder the authority of this act, to the general affembly at their next fession, and within the first ten days after its commencement, in which account shall be specified, under distinct heads, his own receipts, and those of the treasurer, and of all transfers of stock upon which he may be entitled to commission, and in which shall also be contained a particular estimate of his commissions, shewing how and upon what the

XXI. And be it enaffed, That the faid agent shall, within twenty days after the commencement of the next fellion of the general affembly, render to each branch of the legislature a fair and distinct account of the debts or sums of money due to the slate, arranging the names of the debtors in alphabetical order, and give full and complete information of the manner in which, and the time when, each debt srofe, and also the different steps and proceedings which have been taken by himfelf, or others, for the recovery there-

XXII. And be it enaffed, That the faid agent shall be allowed for his fervices the following commissions, to wit: For all payments actually made to either of the treasurers in virtue of this act, three fer cent. and for all bonds taken by the said agent in virtue of this

act, three per cent.

XXIII. And be it enasted, That the faid agent, before he enters upon the execution of the duties of this and council, in the penalty of fixty thousand dollars, with such fecurity as the governor and council, for the faithful performance of the said duties, which bond shall be lodged with the treasurer of the western thore, and shall allo take an oath, before the chancellor, that he will well and faithfully difcharge the duties as agent, under the act, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year eighteen hundred and one, to the best of his skill and judgment; the certificate of which oath shall be annexed to, or en-

dorled on, the faid bond.

XXIV. And be it enoded, That the agent be and he is hereby authorised and directed to collect any sum of fums of money due from persons residents without the flate of Maryland, and, if necessary, sue therefor, and he is also authorised to employ counsel for the recovery of the fame, and give fuch fee as he may think reafonable, and draw on the treasurer of the western shore therefor, who is hereby authorised to pay the amount

of flich order. XXV. And be it enaded, That if the feld agent thall not accept his appointment, or if after his acceptance he shall not give bond, and take the oath aforesaid, before the first day of February next, or shall die, the governor and council are hereby authorised and requested to appoint a fit and prope who hall have and execute all the authorities and powers veffed in the said agent by this act, such per-ion first giving security and taking the oath alore-

faid.

XXVI. Previded always, and be is maded. That the
faid agent thall not be entitled to any commission upon
any monies arising from thes, forfeitures, amerisaments, ordinary, retailers, martiage, hawkers and
pedlers licences, unless in cases where the same shall
not be paid by the theritis and clerks respectively to
the treasurer within one month after the time prescribed by law, and unless the fald agent shall thereafter re-ceive the same from the faid officers respectively, and and unless the faid agent shall thereafter rethe same pay to the fald treasurer.
