In ACT to appoint an agent for the year one thouland eight hundred and one.

BE it enacted, by the general Affembly of Maryland, That Henry Hall Harwood be agent of this state, be execute the trust and power reposed in him by virthe of this act from the first day of January, one thoufind eight hundred and one, until the first day of Ja-

noiry, one thousand eight hundred and two.

II. And be it enatted, That the said agent superintend the collection of all arrearages and balances due from the feveral collectors of the respective counties within this state, and the faid sgent is hereby authorifed and required to call upon the treasurers of the respective shores for an accurate statement of all arrearages and balances due from fuch collectors, and fuch account shall be furnished by the faid treaturers accord.

III. And be it enalled, That the faid agent be authorifed to superintend the collection of balances due to the state on the auditor's books or on open account; and the faid agent shall have power to require payment of, and, if necessary, to sue for and recover the same; and the faid agent, with the approbation of the go-vernor and council, may make composition with any fach debtors, and take bonds to the flete, with fufficient fecurity, and give time for payment, not exreeding two years from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and one.

IV. And be it enafted, That the faid agent be authoifed to superintend the collection of all movies due othe state for naval duties, fines, penalties, forfeitures ad amerciaments, and forfeited recognizances, and or ordinary, retailers and marriage licences, and to equire payment, and (if necessary) fue for and reover the same; and the said agent may allow for indreecies, and credit any money that the party is not hargeable with by law, and, for his information of he law, he may take the advice of the attorhey-geteral in writing.

V. And be it enaded, That whenever there shall be ccation to expole to public fale the property of any ollector, or his securities, by virtue of any execution treaty issued, or to be issued for this purpose, the said gent shall cause at least thirty days public notice to regiven of such sale, and shall attend the same, and shi thall appear that there is danger of losing any part the debt due to the flate, and not otherwise, shall archale any property to expoted to fale for the use of he flate, in payment, or part payment, as the cafe his be, of the arrearages due by the collectors whose roperty may be so purchased, and that no purchase part of the state, unless a public declaration to that fed be made by the agent or his deputy immediately fur such sale and purchase; and any property so purbused for the use of the flate, the said agent may gin expole to public audion, on the most advan-gious terms for the use of the state, and, if the same a fold on credit, which shall in no case exceed the erm of two years, the said agent shall take bond, with nod and sufficient security, to be approved of by the resurer of the western shore, from the purchases of ach property, and all bonds by him so taken shall be de-ofited, with an accurate lift thereof substribed by him, a the treasury of the western shore, and shall be a lien pon the real property of such our chasers, and their on the real property of fuch purchasers, and their fulfiles, from the respective dates, or so much thereess is mentioned in the schedule thereto annexed.

VI. And be it enalted, That the said agent is hereby

VII. And by It evented. That no payment in fringe year of the flat find be and an effective from indebted to the flat find be and an effectively unless made to the treatures of the

western or eastern shore, or to the sgent, or unleis made to the clerks and fheriffs of the feveral counties, in the cates where the faid clerks and theriffs are by law authorised to receive the same.

VIII. And be it enacted, That the agent shall have full power and authority, by and with the advice of the governor and council, in all cases of uninstalled debts, to take back any property heretofore purchased by any person and not yet paid for, in cases where the person so having purchased, and his securities, are notcapable of paying for the fame, and to compromife the fame upon terms and principles of equity and justice, by and with the advice and consent alors aid; and the agent is hereby required to lay a particular flatement of his proceedings under this fection before the next fession of assembly.

IX. And beit enadled, That the agent, with the approbation and confent of the governor and council, be and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to compromise any suit depending in chancery with any state debtor, upon any terms in their judgment calculated to promote the interest of the state, and to obtain the

speedy receipt of the sums due.

X. And be it enacied, That if, under the terms of any compromise made as aforesaid, the property heretotore purchased shall be taken back and revested in the state, the same may be fold by the agent, and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to fell the fame at public fale, giving thirty days notice, on a credit of two years, payable, one half of the principal, and the whole interest annually, on the first day of December in each year; and the bonds, when taken, shall be returned to the treasury of the western shore, and reported to the general assembly at their session next enfuing the taking of fuch bonds.

XI. And be it enacted, That all cases in chancery, where no compromise under this act is effected, that! be placed under the direction of the agent, who is hereby authorised and required to call on the attorneygeneral to profecute or defend the same to immediate final decision; and the governor and council are hereby authorised and empowered, at the requelt of the agent, in cases of difficulty, to aid the attorney-genoral, by employing any person to attend to surveys where necessary, or otherwise to assist in the protecution or defence of faid fuits, which person or perfins are to be paid out of the contingent fund of five hundred pounds; and the names of the persons to emplayed, together with the fum allowed for their fervices, to be laid before the general assembly at their next feffion.

XII. And be it enaded. That if any bond debtor to the tlate for conficered property purchased, or otherwife, shall neglect to make payment, agreeably to the condition of his bond, and fundry reloives of the general affembly, the said agent shall cause process to issue for the whole principal and interest then due, or shall proceed on any execution already iffued, and ferved and suspended, as occasion may require, or, under the directions and with the approbation of the governor and council, he is hereby authorised to delay any execution as long as they may think expedient and necessary.

XIII. And be it enalised, That the faid agent be authorifed to superintend the collection of all balances due on bond taken for taxes due before the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and eightythree; and the faid agent shall also superintend the collection of all balances due on bonds installed, or ortherwise, for the emissions of paper money of seventeen hundred and fixty-nine, and feventeen hundred and feventy-three.

XIV. And be it enacted, That no process shall issue against any of the public debtors, unless by the disection of the faid agent.

XV. And be it enacled, That the faid agent shall have; power to fix such days of sale of property taken by fieri focias, at the fuit of the state, as he may think proper, always taking care to give at least thirty days public notice thereof, and the said agent shall also have power to suspend the sales, from time to time, as he

may think most to the advantage of the state.

XVI. And be it enasted, That the said agent shall pay into the treasury, in specie, the amount of all socie by him received in the discharge of the duties of this act.

XVIII. And be it enacted. That in all cases where bonds shall be taken in virtue of this act, the bonds firell be a lien on the real property of the obligors from the date thereof, or on fo much of the laid teal property as the governor and council thall think fufficient, to be particularly mentioned in a ichedule to be annexed to the faid band, in which cafe it that be a lies on the property contained in such schedule, and no more, such bond and schedule to be lodged with the treasurer of the wellers more.

XVIII. And be it master. That all bonds taken in

which of this set that express the county in which the obligors respectively reade, and the treasurer of the restorer hate he receives them refpectively, canfe them, with me fchedole an-

nexed to them, to be recorded in the office of the clerk of the general court of the wettern thore at the expence of the obligors; and a copy of the faid record, certified under the hand and official feal of the faid clerk, shall be as good evidence in any court of law or equity in this state as the original bond would be if was produced; and if any of the obligors in any fuch bonds refide on the eastern shore, the said treafurer shall, within fix months from the time he rethe general court of the eastern shore, in the same manner as papers on public fervice are transmitted, a copy of fuch bonds and schedules, certified as aforelaid by the clerk of the general court of the western shore, to be recorded in the office of the clerk of the general court of the caffern shore, at the expence of the obligors, and, in such case, a copy of the said record, certified as aforefaid by the clerk of the general court of the eattern shore, shall be good evidence as

XIX. And be it enacted, That the faid agent shall render to the treasurer of the western shore distinct quarterly accounts of his receipts of all money, certificates and bonds, in virtue of this act, and shall immediately thereupon pay and deliver the same to the said treasurer, who shall, in his annual report to the general assembly, state fully and particularly the money, certificates and bonds, by him received from the faid agent, and the times when the fame were reTHE PROPERTY OF THE PROPERTY O

ceived and accounted for.

XX. And be it enacled, That the faid agent shall render a fair and full account of his feveral proceedings, under the authority of this set, to the general affembly at their next fession, and within the first ten days after its commencement, in which account shall be specified, under dittinet heads, his own receipte, and those of the treasurer, and of all transfers of flock upon which he may be entitled to commission, and in which shall also be contained a particular estimate of his commissions, shewing how and upon what the fame arole due.

XXI. And be it enacled, That the faid agent shall, within twenty days after the commencement of the next fession of the general affembly, render to each branch of the legislature a fair and diffinet account of the debts or fums of money due to the tlate, arranging the names of the debtors in alphabetical order, and give full and complete information of the manner in which, and the time when, each debt arcfe, and alfo the different fleps and proceedings which have been taken by himfelf, or others, for the recovery there-

XXII. And be it enacted, That the faid agent shall . be allowed for his fervices the following commissions, to wit: For all payments actually made to either of the treasurers in virtue of this act, three fer cent. and for all bonds taken by the faid agent in virtue of this

act, three per cent XXIII. And be it enadled, That the faid agent, before he enters upon the execution of the duties of this set, shall give bond to the state, before the governor and council, in the penalty of fixty thouland dollars, with fuch fecurity as the governor and council shall approve, for the faithful performance of the faid duties, which bond shall be lodged with the treasurer of the western shore, and shall also take an oath, betere the chancellor, that he will well and faithfully difcharge the duties as agent, under the act, entitled; An act to appoint an agent for the year eighteen hundred and one; to the best of his faill and judgment; the certificate of which oath shall be annexed to, or en-

dorfed on, the faid bond.

XXIV. And be it enasted. That the agent be and he is hereby authorised and directed to collect any sum or fums of money due from persons residents without the state of Maryland, and, if necessary, sue therefor, and he is also authorised to employ counsel for the recovery of the fame, and give fuch fee as he may think reafanable, and draw on the treasurer of the western shore therefor, who is hereby authorised to pay the amount

XXV. And be it enalled, That if the faid agent shall not accept his appointment, or if after his acceptance he shall not give bond, and take the oath sforefuld, before the first day of February next, or shall die, the governor and council are hereby authorised and requested to appoint a sit and proper person in his place, who shall have and execute all the authorities and powers yested in the said agent by this act, such perfon first giving fecurity and taking the oath afore-

XXVI. Provided always, and be it enalled, 'That the faid agent shall not be entitled to any commission up any monies arling from fines, forfeitures, amercia-ments, ordinary, retailets, marriage, hawkers and pedlers licences, unless in cases where the same that not be paid by the theriffs and clerks respectively to the treasurer within one month after the time prescribed by law, and unless the said agent that thereaster receive the same from the said officers respectively, and the lame pay to the laid treaturer. willi
