An ACT to alter, change, and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the time and manner of electing the senate, and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body.

BEITENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the day of

, the fenate of this frate shall consist and be composed of twenty members, one member to be cholen from each of the feveral counties of this flate, and one member from the city of Baltimore; and that the fenators shall be elected for four years by the electors in the feveral counties, and in the city of Biltinore, qualified to vote for members of the house of delegates, at the same time, in the same manner, and at the same places, where they shall vote for members of the house of delegates.

And be it enacted, That no person shall be a se-

nator who shall not have attained the age of twentyfive years, and been a refident of the state four years next before his election, and the last year thereof a refident of the county or city for which he shall be elected, unless he shall have been absent on the public businels of the United States or of this state, and having in the state real and perional property above

the value of \_\_\_\_ dollars.

And be it enacted, That immediately after the fenators shall be affembled in consequence of the first election, they shall be divided by lot into four classes; the feats of the fenators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the first year, of the fecond class at the expiration of the fecond year, of the third class at the expiration of the third year, and of the fourth class at the expiration of the fourth year, fo that one fourth may be chosen every year; and if the feat of any lenator shall become versue by death, relignation or otherwife, a warrant of election shall sflue by the president of the iduate for the election of another in his place, in the fame manner, and under the fame regulations, as warrants of election are iffued by the speaker of the house of delegates, to supply vacancies in that body; and any fenator who may be elected to fill a vacancy shall hold Lis that to long as the perfon in whose place he is selected might have done if no vacancy had happened.

And be it enacted, That if this act thall be con-

firmed by the general affembly, after the next elec-tion of delegates, in the first fellion after fuch new election, as the conflitution and form of government directs, that in such case this act, and the alterations and amendment of the conflitution and form of government therein contained, shall be taken and confilered, and fhall conflitute and be valid, as a part of the faid conflitution and form of government, to all intents and purposes, any thing in the faid conflitu-tion and form of government to the contrary notwithfianding.

And be it enacted, That the fourteenth, fifteenth, fixteenth, feventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth fections of the conflitution and form of government, shall be, and are hereby declared to be, repealed and

abolished on the confirmation hereof.
