An ACT to alter, change, and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as re-late to the time and manner of electing the senate,

and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the day of the senate of this state shall consist and be composed of twenty members, one member to be cholen from each of the feveral counties of this state, and one member from the city of Baltimore; and that the fenators shall be elected for four years by the electors in the feveral counties, and in the city of Baltimore, qualified to vote for members of the house of delegates, at the same time, in the same manner, and at the fame places, where they shall vote for members of the house of delegates.

And be it enacted, That no person shall be a se-nator who shall not have attained the age of twentyfive years, and been a refident of the state four years next before his election, and the last year thereof a resident of the county or city for which he shall be elected, unless he shall have been absent on the public business of the United States or of this state, and having in the state real and personal property above the value of ____ dollars.

And be it enacted, That immediately after the feathators shall be affembled in consequence of the first election, they shall be divided by lot into four classes; the seas of the senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the first year, of the se-cond class at the expiration of the second year, of the third class at the expiration of the third year, and of the fourth class at the expiration of the fourth year, fo that one fourth may be chosen every year; and if the seat of any senator shall become vacant by death, refignation or otherwife, a warrant of election shall issue by the president of the senate for the elec-tion of another in his place, in the same manner, and under the same regulations, as warrants of election are issued by the speaker of the house of delegates, to supply vacancies in that body; and any fenator who may be elected to fill a vacancy shall hold his feat fo long as the person in whose place he is elected might have done if no vacancy had happened.

And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the general affembly, after the next elec-tion of delegates, in the first fession after such new election, as the conflitution and form of government directs, that in fuch case this act, and the alterations and amendment of the constitution and form of government therein contained, shall be taken and confidered, and shall constitute and be valid, as a part of the faid constitution and form of government, to all intents and purposes, any thing in the faid constitution and form of government to the contrary notwithstanding.

And be it enacted, That the fourteenth, fifteenth, fixteenth, feventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth fections of the conflitution and form of government, shall be, and are hereby declared to be, repealed and abolished on the confirmation hereof.

On motion, ORDERED, That the governor and council cause the bill, entitled, An act to alter, change, and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the time and manner of electing the fenate and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, to be inserted in such of the news-papers of this state as to them may appear best calculated to communicate the same to the people of the state.
