HOUSE OF DELEGATES.

WEDNESDAY, January 15, 1806. THE house met. Present as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to establish permanent salaries for the judges, and the meffage relative thereto, the bill for erecting a town at or near the mouth of Will's creek, in Allegany county, the supplement to the act for the relief of fundry infolvent debtors, passed at November session, 1803, the bill to provide for the erection of a new court-house for Baltimore county, and the resolutions in favour of Martha Hall, Patrick Murdock, Anthony Fox, Hezekiah Speake, and Robert Elliott, were fent to the fenate.

The report on the petition of David Hopkins was read the second time and the resolution therein assented to.

Mr. Cox delivers a bill, entitled, An act authoriling the late collectors of public taxes in Cacil couny to complete their feveral collections; which was red the first and second time and passed.

A petition from John R. Caldwell, of the city of Biltimore, was read and referred.

The amendment to the additional supplement to the act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of affembly therein mentioned, was agreed to, and the

In differting from this resolution, the senate are not to be understood expressing an opinion on the propriety of the claim, but because they consider the subject more proper for the decision of the chancellor, who can examine as to the existence of the alleged facts, and the equity of the claim. If your house will originate a resolution, referring the claim to the determination of the chancellor, it will meet with the affent of the senate; which was read. The bill to enlarge the powers of the levy court of Baltimore county, and for other purposes, was read the second time and passed:

The house proceeded to ballot for a register of wills for St. Mary's county, and upon examining the ballots it appeared, that Edmund Key was elected, and he was accordingly recommended to the governor to be commissioned as register of wills for St. Mary's

A petition from Henry Lamot, of Baltimore county, was read and referred.

Mr. Ellicott delivers a bill, entitled, An act to afcertain the mode of completing the title to purchasers of certain confiscated British property, and for other purposes; which was read.

Mr. Ellicott also delivers a bill, entitled, An act to empower William Finn, of Baltimore county, to keep a public pound in the county of Baltimore, and for other purposes therein mentioned; which was read.

On motion, the question was put, That the further consideration of said bill be referred to the next general affembly? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Scott delivers a bill, entitled, An act to appoint commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Chester-town, in Kent county, and for other purposes; which was read.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning.

THURSDAY, January 16, 1806.
THE house met. Present as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Ogden delivers a report on the petition of Henry Lamot, against the petitioner; which was read and concurred with.

The bill to restrain the evil practices of certain persons within this state, was read the second time and paffed.

The resolutions in favour of Jesse Jarrett were read the fecond time, and the question put, Will the house affent to the first resolution? Determined in the negative. A resolution in lieu thereof was then assented to, and the question put, Will the house assent to the second resolution? Resolved in the affirmative.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill to reduce into one the feveral acts of affembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections, and the bill being read throughout, and amended, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the fenate delivers the bill to lay out and make a public road from William Pyle's fawmill, on Deer-creek, in Harford county, the further supplement to the act to incorporate companies to make feveral turnpike roads through Baltimore county, the bill authorifing the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of St. Mary's college in Baltimore county, feverally endorfed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, agreed to, and the bills ordered to be engraffed. The supplement to the act authorling a lottery to raise a fum of money for repairing Shrewibury church, in Kent county, the bill to amend, and make conveniently pallable, the public road leading from the lands of Mrs. Dennison to the upper ferry in the town of Havre-de-Grace, the bill to authorife the drawing of a lottery within the city of Baltimore for the purpole therein mentioned, the hill for the relief of John R. Caldwell, and the bill authoriting a lottery to raise a fum of money for the purpole of rebuilding the fleeple of the German reformed church in Frederick-town, bill ordered to be engraffed. THE house met. Present as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion, Ordered, That the additional supplement to the act for the relief of creditors, and to prevent frauds and deceits occasioned by fecret fales, and mortgages and gifts, of goods and chattels, be recommitted for amendment.

Mr. Lemmon delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to establish two additional warehouses in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco; which was read.

Ordered, That the report of the committee of conference be recommitted for amendment.

Mr. Watts delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the

regulation of officers fees; which was read. On motion, the question was put, That the further confideration of the faid bill be referred to the next general affembly? Determined in the negative-Yeas -Nays 34.

On motion, the question was put, That the same have a second reading on Monday week next? Determined in the negatives

The question was then put, That the same have a fecond reading on Wednesday next? Resolved in the affirmative.

According to order, the house proceeded to the second reading of the bill, authoriting the extention of the Falls turnpike to the Pennsylvania line, and after making an amendment thereto, the question was put, That the further consideration of the said bill be referred to the first day of June next? Resolved in the affirmative—Yeas 37—Nays 20.
