By a letter from Washington, of the 23d instant, we receive the following information:—

"That it was generally understood the doors of the house of representatives had been latterly closed in consequence of certain propositions offered by Mr. J. Randolph—which were acceded to by the house, and which are to form the basis of a communication to Mr. Munroe, and upon which he is to require an answer. It is the firm opinion of the friends of the Union, that the government has acted with much decision, and that they are not disposed to relax a single inch, appears to be the general opinion. It appears to be a matter of some importance to know what government intend—this is impossible, at present, for one to ascertain. A pamphlet has just been published in direct opposition to the British doctrines of neutral rights—it is ascribed to Mr. Madison. If it is written by him, it may be expected to express the sentiments of the Executive on this momentous question."
