A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been stated to me by petition of a number of respectable inhabitants of Prince-George's county, that a man has been committed on the person of CHARLES NEVITT, junior, late of Prince-Georges county, a certain negro man, slave of Basil Soper, called WALL, who has since absconded and fled from justice. And whereas it is the duty of the executive guard as much as may be against the commission of such enormities, and to bring such offenders against the laws and peace of society to justice, I have therefore thought proper to issue this my proclamation, to do, by and with the advice and consent of the council, offer a reward of ONE HUNDRED DOLARS to any person or persons who shall apprehend and secure the said negro WALL in any gaol in the United States, so that he be brought to justice.

GIVEN in council at the city of Annapolis, videlicet the seal of the state of Maryland, this sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six.
