Warland, in 9 days from Halifax, informs, that the British August packet had arrived at that place; that the Jason had returned from New York; with 50 of her crew in irons; that the Bellona, capt. Hardy, had failed for the Chefapeake; and that a temporary embargo was to be laid the day after he came away, on account of the failing of fome transports, with troops on board, supposed for Quebec.
