SUMACK.

The feafon is now commencing for collecting Sumak. Large quantities of this article, fo important in he manufacture of Morocco Leather, has hitherto een imported from Europe, at double the price for which it may be collected in this country, where it is native, growing fpontan-outly in every part of the United States .- The annual Supplies of Sumack collected in this country has never equalled the confumption, recourse has consequently been always had to Europe. Yet no species of labour has afforded the farmers more profit, nor is anything to eafily collected and prepared; this article now fells current at 60 dollars per tun, of which two boys from 10 to 13 years of age may collect a tun per day where it grows

The method of collecting and preparing Sumachis fimple, and may be accomplished by any farmer: it touills merely of firipping the bulh of all the branches containing leaves only, these are spread out and male like hay, and when fufficiently dry fo as not to heat, it is put into a barn on flacks, after which it is put into a tanner's bark mill and ground fine and fifted from the stems, in this state it is put into bags or cake and fold to the manufacturer or merchant.

Samack is a both or plant growing almost every bere on barren or uncultivated grounds; it bears a seebunch of red berries, which however are not affind to mix with the leaves. The time of col-ding Sunrack commences from the 15, of June, and continues till frost, the best however's collected m! bears a better price .- Care must be taken that it does not get weet, a circumstance which mate-
