Mr. Pinkney's letter to lord Wellesley. Great Cumberland Piace, August 25, 1810. Lord,

I have the honour to state to your Ibrdilip. at I have received from general Armstrong. offer plenipotentiary of the United State Paris, a letter bearing date the 6th inby in which he informs me that the goment of France has revoked the decree Berlin and Milan - and that he has reind a written and official notice of that tin the following words :- " Je fuis quife a " vous declarer, monfieur, que les Decrets de Berlin et de Milan son revoques, et qu' a dater du ler Novemble il cesseront d'avoir leur estect."

I am commanded by his majefly to repeat that declaration, and to affure you that whenever the repeal of the French decrees shall have actually taken effect, and the commerce of the neutral nations thatt have been reftored to the condition in which it flood previously to the promulgation of those decrees, his majesty will feel the highest satisfaction in re-linquishing a system, which the conduct of the enemy compelled him to adopt.
