EXCHANGE OF OLD SIX PER CENT AND DEFERRED STOCK

Pursuant to the act of Congress, entitled,
authorising a subscription for the old six
cent and deferred stocks, and providing for
exchange of the same," passed on the 6th day
July, 1812, books will be opened on the first
of October next, at the Treasury, and at the
veral loan offices, and will continue open till
17th day of March next, for receiving subscrip-
ons of the old six per cent and deferred stocks,
the manner prescribed by the said act. New cer-
ificates, bearing interest from the first day of
quarter in which the subscription shall be made,
the rate of six per centum per annum, payable
quarter-yearly, for the unredeemed amount,
principal of the old six per cent and defere-
stocks which may be subscribed, will be issued
the Treasury or at the Loan Offices respectively,
where the old stock subscribed may be redem-
stand credited. The new stock will be released
at the pleasure of the United States at any
after the 31st day of December, 1824; but re-
imbursement will be made except for the whole
amount of the stock standing at the time, to
credit of any proprietor, on the books of the
sury or of the commissioners of loans respect-
nor till after at least six months previous
notice of such intended reimbursement.
