Copy of a letter from Brig. General

Head Quarters, 3d Brigade,

Baltimore, Sept. 15, 1814.

Major Gen. S. Smith,

SIR—I have the honour to report to
you, that in obedience to your orders, I
marched from Baltimore on Sunday the
11th inst. with part of my brigade, as
the advanced corps of the army under
your command. My force consisted of
550 of the 5th regt. under Lt. Col. Ster-
