Ordered that the following Bill reported at the last session of Assembly entitled "An Act to regulate and discipline the Militia of this State," be printed five times in the Maryland Gazette, the Federal Gazette, Federal Republican, Telegraph, Herald, Torch Light, and Monitor at Eastern. AN ACT, To Regulate and Discipline the Militia of this State. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all able bodied white male citizens, between eighteen and forty-five years of age, residents in this state, except the vice president of the United States, the members of both houses of Congress, and their respective officers, the officers judicial and executive of the government of the United States, all custom house officers, with their clerks, all post officers, and stage drivers who are employed in the care and conveyance of the mail of the post office of the United States, all ferriesmen employed at any ferry on the post road, all inspectors of exports, all pilots, all mariners actually employed in the sea service of the United States, the members of the executive council, and their clerks, the chancellor, the judges of the county courts, and the clerks of those courts, the judges of the court of oyer and terminer and gaol delivery of Baltimore county, and the clerk of that court, the register of the different counties of this state, and the judges of the phans courts, the register in chancery, the registers of the land office, and clerks of the court of appeals, and the members of the legislature of the state, and their clerks, whitts in session, the professors and masters of all colleges and public schools, schoolmasters and practicing physicians, all mariners actually engaged in the coasting trade from one state to another, the assessors of the western and eastern shore, and auditor, and also all ministers of the gospel, regular, ordained, licensed or recognised, any religious society, all quakers, menonists, tinkers, and persons conscientiously scrupulous of bearing arms, shall be subject to do militia duty under this act: provided that no person shall be exempted from militia duty on account of conscientious scruples, who shall produce to the captain, or commanding officer of the district where he resides, a certificate from a licensed preacher of the gospel, signed by the proper officer of the religious society to which such person may belong, (except where such society shall exist that there may be had to) in substance follows, to wit: "I, the subscriber of the meeting or district do hereby certify, that I do believe that his exemplary deportment, uniform declarations; and from frequently and usually attending with said society for public worship, is conscientiously scrupulous of bearing arms; provided that each quaker, menonist, or person conscientiously scrupulous of bearing arms, be eighteen and forty-five years of age, and all other persons under this act, (except ministers of the gospel) shall be exempted from militia duty according to the provisions of this act, (except on the payment of ten dollars yearly. And it shall at all times be the duty of every captain or commanding officer of a company, not every able bodied white
