PROCLAMATION.

Whereas, by an inquisition held on

as he has been represented to me, that the

and it being of the greatest importance
to the society, that the perpetration of such
a crime should be brought to condign
punishment—I have, therefore, thought
proper to issue this my proclamation,
to do by and with the advice and con-
sent of the Council, offer a reward of
one Hundred Dollars to any person
who shall apprehend and deliver the
said Obed Griffith to the Sheriff of Bal-
timore county.
