ILLEGAL VOTING.
The State of Maryland vs. Thos. Abbot.
This was an action before a Justice...
of the Peace, to recover the penalty...
of \$20 imposed by the 25th section...
of the act to regulate elections, on...
any person who shall offer to vote...
in any district or county other than...
that in which he resides. It was...
alleged, that the defendant, being...
a resident of Talbot county, had...
voted on the seventh instant, in the...
eighth ward of the city of Balti-
more. The voting was admitted,
but, on the part of the defendant, it...
was contended, that he was the...
owner and master of a schooner lying...
at Light-street wharf, within the...
eighth ward, that his constant occu-
pation was trading in that vessel...
between Baltimore and Oxford, in...
Talbot county, and although his...
vessel hailed from Oxford, yet being...
a single man, without a family, he...
was entitled to vote in the district...
where his vessel (which he considered...
his home) was on the day of election.
Judgment was given against the...
defendant, from which he prayed an...
appeal to the County court.—
Fed. Gaz.

Latest from England.

of the 14th Sept. asserts that the...
new arrangements of the cabinet...
are completed, and that Mr. Can-
ning has accepted the seals of the...
Foreign Office, in the place of the...
late Marquis of Londonderry.
SPAIN.
The accounts from here are satis-
factory—they are down to the 29th...
August, by which it appears that...
the extraordinary Cortes were con-
voked for the 25th Sept. The king...
signed the decree on the 25th for...
its assemblage, but not without...
considerable difficulty and not until...
the ministers had addressed him on...
the subject, and begged him to yield...
to their entreaties.

THE GREEKS.
Further accounts have been re-
ceived of the successes of the Greeks...
in the early part of July, and con-
taining statements of subsequent...
successes. An article appeared in...
the Paris papers of the 10th, dated...
Semlin, the 24th Aug. confirming...
the defeat of Courchid Pacha on...
the 20th July, near Larissa. The...
account adds, that threatened by...
the Divan, he assembled all his...
reserves, and led them to the theatre...
of his defeat, but the Greeks again...
intercepted him, and on the 1st of...
August he lost as many lives as on...
the 20th July, and was himself taken...
prisoner.
The account of the above battle...
was not believed at St. Petersburg...
on the 20th of August.
THE TURKS.
The Porte has, it is said, had...
serious differences with the French...
ambassador, who it is reported has...
threatened to retire.
The Egyptian and main Turkish...
fleets formed a junction off Scio a...

about the first of Aug. A letter from...
Leighfort, Aug. 27, says, the com-
bined Ottoman fleet of six sail of...
the line, many frigates and trans-
ports, have added a number of...
troops in the Morea.

RUSSIA.
An extraordinary proceeding, &...
one which has excited very consid-
erable sensation in the public mind,
has recently taken place in the Rus-
sian capital. It appears by a St. Petersburg...
article of the 21st that an order had...
been issued for the closing of all...
the Free Masons Lodges. Simultaneous...
with this act, and perhaps a consequ-
ence of it, was the seizure, in Paris, of...
all the papers belonging to a venerable...
Mason of that city, by a police officer.

THE CONGRESS.
A Berlin article mentions that...
the Kings of Naples and Sardinia, are...
expected to be present at the...
Congress at Verona.
It was reported at Frankfort Sep-
tember 9, that a part of the Aus-
trian troops in Italy, had march-
ed through France (towards Spain) to...
relieve the sanitary cordon. This...
report caused a fall in stocks at...
Brussels.
