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LEGISLATURE OF MARYLAND. Abstract of the Proceedings of THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES.

Monday, Jan. 6. Mr. Purviance reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Everiste Maury of the city of Baltimore; Mr. John P. Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of George Yeaman, of the City of Baltimore; and Mr. Howard reports a bill, entitled, An act to appoint a collector, of the county tax for each election district in Anne-Arundel county, and for other purposes; which were read.

Mr. Gerry reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of James C. McDowell, of Cecil county; which was read. Mr. Merrick presents a petition from Henry D. Sellers, of Queen Anne's county, praying he may be authorized to sell the real estate of John Eagle, late of Caroline county, deceased; read and referred.

Mr. Millard reports the bill to authorize the levy court of Saint-Mary's county to assess a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed. Mr. Steele reports a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a wharf at the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county; which was read.

Mr. Duvall, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act incorporating into one the several acts relating to constables fees. On motion by Mr. Thomas, Leave given to bring in a bill to restrain and punish trespassers.

Mr. Norris reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to make public the proceedings of the levy courts in the several counties in this state; and Mr. Teackle reports a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act to prevent the inconveniences arising from slaves being permitted to act as free; which were read.

Mr. Carroll presents a petition from John Stalker, praying support for his sick brother; read and referred to the committee appointed on similar petitions. Mr. Howard presents a petition from John C. Weems, of Anne-Arundel county, proposing the establishing of district free-schools; read and referred to the committee appointed on similar subjects.

Mr. Madox, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to writs of certiorari, and prohibition, and for other purposes.

Mr. Sheredine, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to regulate fences within Cecil county.

Mr. Thomas Kennedy, Ordered, That a committee to consist of seven members, be appointed to inquire upon what terms the several turnpike companies in the state would consent to let all wagons having tires of four inches in width, pass to market toll free; and report the result to this house.

Mr. Purviance presents a petition from Anne Ryan, praying for a divorce; read and referred to the committee appointed on similar petitions. And a petition from Robert Oliver, praying for a release of the state's right to the property therein mentioned; read and referred.

Mr. Allen, Ordered, That Messrs. Allen, Stansbury and Lloyd, be a committee to report on the state of the different institutions for education receiving donations from the state. The bill to authorize William Fountain, to convey certain lands therein mentioned, and for other purposes, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Norris reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to make public the proceedings of the levy courts in the several counties in this state; and Mr. Teackle reports a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act to prevent the inconveniences arising from slaves being permitted to act as free; which were read.

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Mr. Sheredine, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of certain funds for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named.

Mr. John P. Kennedy presents a petition from Ann Speddon, of the city of Baltimore; read and referred to the committee on petitions and revolutionary claims. Mr. Merrick presents a petition from Richard Moffitt, of Queen Anne's county; for an abatement of interest on a judgment against him; read and referred.

Mr. Jones reports a bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Somerset county; and Mr. Teackle reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs of Jesse H. Wainright, late of Somerset county; which were read.

Mr. Orrick presents a petition from Henry Lamont, of Baltimore county, praying that a lease may be made valid; read and referred. Mr. Stansbury presents a petition from John Murray, of Baltimore county, praying he may be authorized to collect the damages sustained and allowed by the commissioners for opening Aisquith street; read and referred.

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
