WHEREAS it has been represented to the executive, that Levin Johnson, alias Statia, and Isaac Johnson, alias Statia, who were sentenced by the western county court, at November term last, to a confinement in the Maryland Penitentiary, for kidnapping; and Eli Roberts, who was sentenced to the said Penitentiary for ten years for a rape, made their escape on their way to the said Penitentiary. And whereas, it is at all times important, that persons offending against the laws should be brought to justice, but particularly in cases of the above description I have deemed it to be proper to issue this my proclamation, and do, by and with the advice and consent of the council, offer a reward of THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS, to any person or persons who shall apprehend the said mentioned persons, or ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS for each, provided he or they be duly lodged in my goal of this state, or elsewhere: And whereas, it has been further stated to the executive department, that the fodder house of Robert Yeo, of Calvert county, was consumed by fire on the night of the twenty sixth day of December last, and that there is strong reason to believe that it was set on fire by some evil disposed person or persons. Now therefore, that the perpetrator thereof may be brought to condign punishment I do, by and with the advice and consent of the council, offer a reward of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS to any person who shall discover, apprehend, and procure to conviction, the perpetrator of the said act.
