AN ACT. To repeal an act, entitled, 'An act to alter, change and repeal such parts of the Constitution and Form of Government of this state as relate to the division of St. Mary's county into four election districts,' passed at November session, one thousand eight hundred and six, and confirmed at November session, one thousand eight hundred and seven.

Whereas, It is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of sundry inhabitants of Saint Mary's county, that they experience great inconvenience from the magnitude and extent of the fourth election district in said county, operating to deprive many of their suffrages, who are entitled to the exercise of that right; and as it is desirable that the full, free and fair voice of the people should be expressed in their choice of the functionaries of government; therefore,

1.
