Experiment relative to Yellow fever, performed by M. Guyon, at Fort Bayal Martinique.

June 15th, 1822, he took the shirt of a soldier affected with the yellow fever, which was completely soaked (soute-imbibe) in the sweat of the patient, put it on immediately, and wore it for 24 hours.

June 30, M. Guyon drank a small glass, holding about two ounces, of the glass vomit, and afterwards having rubbed both arms with the same matter, was inoculated with it by M. Cuppe.

July 1st, A patient having died of the yellow fever on the fifth day of the disease, M. Guyon put on his shirt impregnated with black matter still warm, and immediately went into the bed of the deceased, which was soiled. He remained 6 hours and a half, sweated and slept in it, in presence of many witnesses.

July 2, The patient who had afforded the opportunity of making the first experiment having died, his body was opened. The stomach contained a pretty large quantity of black matter of a bloody appearance, and the internal membrane was red and inflamed.
