LEGISLATURE OF MARYLAND.

Abstract of the Proceedings OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES.

Thursday, January 19, 1826. The additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers...

Mr. Howard presents a petition from Charles F. Pochon and Eulalie M. L. Pochon, praying for an act to regulate the distribution of an estate therein mentioned...

Mr. Shower presents a petition from the Synod of the Reformed Church of the United States, praying the passage of a law to restrain Sabbath breaking...

Mr. Teackle reports a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this state.

Mr. Duval reports a bill, entitled, An act to repeal a supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prevent the unlawful exportation of negroes and mulattoes...

Mr. Kershner reports a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act to authorize the levy court of Washington county to levy a sum of money for the purpose of purchasing and providing a farm...

Mr. Barnes reports a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the more comfortable maintenance of sick persons confined in the several jails of this state.

Mr. S. R. Smith reports a bill, entitled, An act to relieve executors and administrators from the obligation of performing the duties of guardians, as is required by an act passed at December session 1820, chapter 174.

Mr. Tyson reports the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the members of the Independent Odd Fellows Society, as amended. Ordered, That the same have a second reading on the 24th inst.

The resolution relative to returns of the amount of fines, to be made by colonels of regiments, to the legislature, was read the second time. Mr. Sappington moved to strike out colonels, to insert captains, when Mr. Barnes moved to refer the same to the 1st of June...

The order relative to giving notice of intended applications for divorce, was read the second time.

Mr. Tyson moved the following as an amendment: Provided, that this order shall not be construed to extend to petitions for divorces now before the house. Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the order as amended? Determined in the negative.

The order directing the committee of grievances and courts of justice, to enquire whether the judges and clerks have done their duty as prescribed by the act of 1817, chapter 119, was read the second time and assented to.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, the resolution relative to a naval academy, was made the order of the day for the 25th inst.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, he was excused from serving on the committee of ways and means, and the chair appointed Mr. Edelen in his place.

The orders proposed by Mr. Teackle, relative to the penitentiary, were read the second time, the 1st and 2d were assented to; the 3d was dissented from, and the residue assented to.

Friday, Jan. 20. The bill for the relief of Samuel Lee, of Harford county, was read the second time by special order, passed, and returned to the senate. Mr. Dalrymple reports a bill, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of William C. Dawkins, late a justice of the peace for Calvert county, which was twice read by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.
