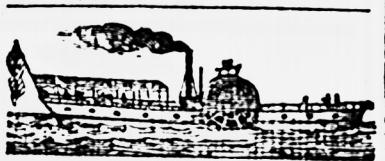

THE STEAM BOAT MARYLAND
