wed him money. As the father was in the act of picking it up, the brother seized his gun, cocked it and discharged a ball into his sister's breast. She shrick. ed-her father attempted to catch her in his arms, but she fell streamin with blood, and was a corpse in a few hours.

The murderer retreated a short distance from the house, and in stantly another shot was heard. He was discovered shortly afterwards about 60 yards from the dwelling. suspended by a rope to the limb of a tree with his knees nearly touch ing the ground, part of his jaws and nose were hit way, and his throat partially cut His gun was found re loaded, leaning against tree, and his knife, coat and waistcoat lying on the ground near it - Reading, (Pa) Journal of Feb. 17.
