APPRENTICES.
 A Further Supplement to an Act, entitled, "An Act for the better regulation of Apprentices."
 [Passed March 2, 1827.]
 WHEREAS it is represented to the general assembly, that under the act of assembly passed at November session seventeen hundred and ninety-four, entitled, "A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the better regulation of apprentices, justices of the peace, remote from the seat of justice of the counties, and unapprized of the orphans courts being in session, have, during the sessions of said courts, bound out apprentices, agreeably to the terms, regulations and restrictions, prescribed by the act to which this is a further supplement; and it is right and proper, and for the benefit of all parties, that the stipulations of the contracts of apprenticeship so made, should be fulfilled; Therefore,
 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all contracts of apprenticeship, heretofore made by justices of the peace as aforesaid, during the sessions of the orphans courts of the county in which they reside, be and the same are hereby confirmed and made valid: *Provided* always, that this act shall not be construed to extend to any contract of apprenticeship, so made as aforesaid, which shall not have been approved and recorded agreeably to the sixth section of the law, to which this is a further supplement; *And provided* also, that said contracts shall, in all other respects, be in conformity with the terms, regulations and restrictions, of said original act, and of the several supplements thereto.
 2. *And be it enacted,* That at any time after the passage of this act, any two justices of the peace of the county, in which the person to be bound out may reside, shall, and they are hereby empowered, to bind out as an apprentice any child which the orphans court of such county may lawfully bind out, subject to the terms, regulations and restrictions, prescribed by the act of seventeen hundred and ninety-three, chapter forty-five, and of the supplements thereto, to which this is a further

PHYSICKING POULTRY.
 We became acquainted lately with two very remarkable facts, the one of which relates to hens, and the other to poultry of all kinds, if tolerably fed, are apt to become very fat; and it is during this period that eggs are scarce, and of course dearest. To remedy this in some measure, several farmers' wives in this neighbourhood, are actually in the habit of physicking their chickens, and the practice is said to have a wonderful effect in restoring their suspended laying powers. The recipe is exceedingly cheap and simple, and may be recorded here for the benefit of our wives in other quarters. Dilute and mix two ounces of glauber salts in a dish of cold porridge, or any other food, and scatter the same well about the poultry yard, so that no bird may eat too much; and if the effects are not apparent in two or three days, repeat the dose at short intervals, till the accumulation of eggs indicate that you have gone far enough. On a farm not many miles from this town, the family complained that although they had dozens of lazy hens, they could not get a single egg to breakfast, and this circumstance reminded one of the daughters of the necessity of having recourse to her wretched charms. To work therefore she set, to the great annoyance of an English dairymaid, who averred that although she had hundreds of poultry under her charge, she never before heard of such a thing, and that she was sure the birds would all die. Miss —, however persevered, and in the course of a very few days, Esther found several eggs, and from that moment declared herself a firm convert to the improved method of managing poultry.
