IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT.
The Senate of Maryland on yesterday passed a bill to abolish imprisonment for debt in certain amount on Magistrate's Judgment, and engaged for a third reading—yesterday.

STATE TEMPERANCE SOCIETY.
On Tuesday 23rd ultimo, the Rev. J. W. Ward, Agent of the "American Temperance Society" delivered an address in the House of Delegates to the members of the Legislature and a number of Citizens. He addressed a number of the individuals who formed themselves into a Temperance Society, and adopted the following:

CONSTITUTION.
ART. 1. This Society shall be called the MARYLAND TEMPERANCE SOCIETY.
ART. 2. All persons who subscribe to this Constitution, and all Officers of Temperance Societies in the State of Maryland, shall be members of this Society.

ART. 3. The object of this Society shall be to discourage and to counteract, by every means in its power, the use of intoxicating liquors, and to promote health and comfort of life, but positively refusing to be any way connected with the sale or consumption of any of the same, which are invariably pernicious to the health and moral constitution of mankind.

ART. 4. The subscribers to this Constitution as members of this Society, agree to refrain from the use of ardent spirits, and to encourage the use of them by all suitable means in the community at large.

ART. 5. The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and twelve Directors, who shall be chosen annually by ballot, and shall constitute a Board of Directors—five of whom shall rotate a quorum to transact business, and remain in office until a new election shall place.

ART. 6. The Board of Directors shall take such measures as they may judge expedient to promote health and temperance throughout the State, and report annually to the Society.

ART. 7. There shall be an annual meeting of the Society in Annapolis, during the session of the Legislature, at such time and place as the Board of Directors may appoint.

ART. 8. Any member in default of meeting take omission from the Society, giving a written notice of his desire to the Secretary.
