MARYLAND LEGISLATURE. HOUSE OF DELEGATES.

Wednesday, February 27th, 1833.

Mr. Lantz presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying an alteration in the law relating to trespass.

Mr. Lantz presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Washington county, counter to the report of the committee on Internal Improvements...

Mr. Louthan presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying a change in the disposition of the fund now appropriated to the Cumberland Academy...

Mr. Slicer presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying aid from the state to erect a bridge across the Big Youghiogony river...

Mr. Hope obtained leave to bring in a bill, supplementary to an act passed at November session 1799, chap. 62, concerning persons holding offices of profit and trust under the United States Government.

Mr. Nicolaus, from the joint committee on the Library, submitted the following resolution: Resolved, That the governor and council, be and they are hereby authorized and required...

Mr. Adams presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying aid from the state to erect a bridge across the Big Youghiogony river...

The house resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act to promote internal improvement, by the construction of a Rail-Road from Baltimore...

Mr. Colman from the committee on Internal Improvements, to which was referred, the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Somerset and Worcester Rail-Road Company...

Which were severally read the first and second times by special order and assented to. The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

Resolved, That the governor and council, be and they are hereby authorized and required, when the aforesaid catalog shall have been printed, to make such compensation to the state librarian, as they shall deem adequate for the making out, and superintending the printing of the same.

Mr. Wright, of Q. A. reported a bill to release any right which the state may have to the real and personal estate of the late Jacob Hamilton, free negro, and for other purposes.

Mr. Louthan reported a bill, to change the disposition of the fund appropriated to the Cumberland Academy in Allegany county.

Mr. Evans reported a supplement to an act, to provide for electing commissioners for Cecil county, by districts, and prescribing their powers and duties passed, December session, 1831, chap. 164.

the use of literature in the respective counties and in the city of Baltimore. On motion by Mr. Harper, seconded by two other members who voted in the majority, the house reconsidered their vote upon said amendment.

Determined in the negative. Mr. Jenkins then moved to amend said report by adding at the end of the resolution, the following: To be taken out of the school fund now in the Treasury, and to be deducted from the amount to be given to Anne-Arundel county, whenever that fund may be distributed.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, said report was amended by adding at the end thereof the following: And be it further resolved, That his Excellency the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Delegates, be, on behalf of the State, members of the Board of Visitors and Governors of said College.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, said report was further amended by adding at the end thereof, the following provision: Provided, That the Visitors and Governors of the said College before the receipt of the annuity hereby granted, shall file their acceptance of these conditions in the office of the clerk of the court of appeals of the western shore, to be recorded among the records thereof.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Visitors and Governors of Saint John's College, be and they are hereby authorized to commence an action in Anne Arundel county court, against the state of Maryland, in which the said Visitors and Governors, shall declare against said state, as for money had and received by said state, and for the use of said Visitors and Governors, and the Attorney General shall appear to the said action and on behalf of the said state plead non assumpsit thereto.

Resolved, That the governor and council, be and they are hereby authorized and required, to cause to be printed and sold, a copy of the index to the laws of Maryland, from 1825 to 1831, to each court, and to each judge or justice of said court, and to each member of the general assembly.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Visitors and Governors of Saint John's College, be and they are hereby authorized to commence an action in Anne Arundel county court, against the state of Maryland, in which the said Visitors and Governors, shall declare against said state, as for money had and received by said state, and for the use of said Visitors and Governors, and the Attorney General shall appear to the said action and on behalf of the said state plead non assumpsit thereto.

Resolved in the affirmative. On motion by Mr. Mudd, the house took up for consideration, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to prevent the unreasonable delay of justice, and accumulations of unnecessary law suits in the courts of this state.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed. The clerk of the senate returned the bill, to regulate the compensation of Jurors and witnesses in Somerset and Worcester counties.

Also, the bill, for the relief of Bernard Henry, late of the city of Baltimore. Also, the bill, to explain and amend an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company, under the name of the Washington county bank, at the town of Williamsport, in Washington county.

Also, the bill, to repeal an act, entitled, an act to abolish imprisonment for debt on certain judgments rendered by justices of the peace, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 153.

Also, the bill, relating to the last will and testament of Mary Elizabeth Chuet, of the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed, will pass, and ordered to be engrossed. Also, the supplement to an act, to provide for taking testimony in civil cases, passed at December session, 1833, ch. 165, endorsed, will pass with the proposed amendments.
