The New York papers are filled with ac ounts from the frontier, all indicating a considerable degree of excitement on account of the estruction of the Siz Robert Peel on the one side, and the retaliatory attack upon the Tole-graph on the other. Sir John Colborne arrives entreal on Tuesday the 5th inst. with scral officers of the army, and left immediately for Upper Canada. The Herald says, "His Exellency will inspect Fort Henry, and give the ecessary orders for erecting fortifications along the frontier, in case of a general war, now ning more probable every day.
